The Union County Vocational-Technical Schools are proud to be a part of the educational training pro-

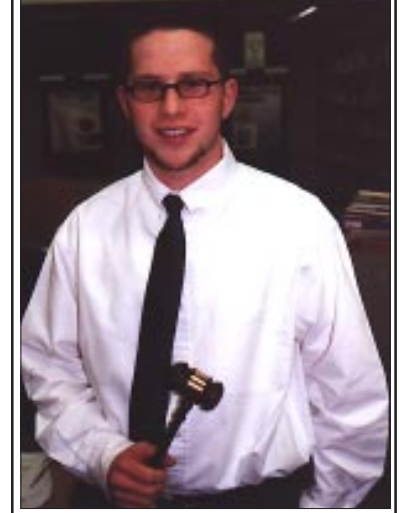

Westfield Foundation Awards Grants Totaling \$44,360

WESTFIELD - Ten organizations were recently awarded grants totaling \$44,360 by the Westfield Foundation.

The Interfaith Council for the Homeless of Union County received \$10,000 toward the purchase of a new van.

A grant of \$2,000 will be used by the Arc of Union County to provide individuals with developmental disabilities an opportunity to find a hobby and be active in the community. The grant helps fund a quilt making project at the Westfield Y.

The Westfield/Mountainside Chapter of the American Red Cross will provide babysitter training courses for local teenagers with the help of a \$2,510 grant.

A \$2,000 grant was awarded to Amateur Astronomers Inc. for the purchase of a computer. The organization offers programs at the William Miller Sperry Observatory at Union County College's Cranford campus.

The Westfield Kidsave Committee plans to bring seven orphaned children from Eastern Europe to

Westfield for a six-week visit, with the anticipation that they will be adopted. A grant of \$6,000 will provide seed money for a self-sustaining program which will allow the project to continue year after year.

To provide start-up funding for a schoolyard habitat, the Franklin Elementary School Parent Teacher Association was granted \$2,250.

A grant of \$2,000 was awarded to the Friends of Girls' Lacrosse to buy new uniforms and equipment for the Freshman, Junior Varsity and Varsity teams this season.

With a grant of \$15,600 to the New Jersey Workshop for the Arts, scholarships will be provided for needy children to participate in the Summer Workshop for 2001.

The Westfield High School Japanese Exchange Program will be assisted in providing a visit for seven Japanese students and their advisor with a grant of \$1,000.

The Westfield Day Care Center received a grant of \$1,000 to give students an opportunity to learn about French language and culture.
