One thing that the Blue Devils wanted to strive for this year was scoring runs early. In their very first game of the season, Westfield scored nine runs in the first inning. They tallied 161 runs over the course of the year. They also were very strong on extra base hits, recording 53 doubles, 10 triples and nine home runs.

Senior Mike Sofka led the team with three triples over the season. He also tied with Cook for the team, lead in home runs, with two. Seniors John Leonardis and Jim McKeon provided key hits late in the season, especially in the county tournament.

Senior Blair Richardson, who had an on-base-percentage of .393 on the year, had mixed feelings on the season. "We feel we fell short because we had a first round exit in the states. We did accomplish some of our goals, though," he said.

Union won in the finals of the state tournament, and Richardson has some thoughts on the Farmer team. "We know we're better than Union. It's sort of disappointing because we feel we could have been in a position to win the state title,"

Richardson said.
 Still, Westfield won the county tournament for their 11th time, the most out of any team in the Union County.

One of the highlights for Brewster and the Westfield team was the semi-final county game against Plainfield. The game lasted 11 innings, and the Blue Devils eventually came from behind to record a victory. "Some people said this was one of the best high school games they've ever seen," said Brewster.

This season, Westfield graduates eight players. Brewster still thinks that Westfield will be a force next year.

"Garrison and Brian Butts have the capability to be some of the top pitchers in the county. Our returning pitchers were 15-5 this season with more than 100 innings under their belts," said Brewster.
