Featured attractions will include a sled dog demonstration, the Skyhoundz Frisbee Dogs, guided dog walks, pony rides by Swift Farms and a talk on reptile care, plus children's games, crafts and face painting. Animal welfare organizations will provide pet care information and bring animals that are available for adoption.

Kathy Murarik of the New Jersey Sled Dog Club will return to demonstrate her sled dog team. She and her team will "pull" off the afternoon's first demonstration at 12:30 p.m., with her dogs hitched to a sled specially modified for the New Jersey terrain.

The Union County Sheriff's K-9 Division will be featured at 1:30 p.m.

At 2 p.m., the Sidewinders Reptile Club will introduce the pros and cons of reptile care with live snakes, lizards, geckos and bearded dragons.

The Skyhoundz Frisbee dogs will demonstrate feats of canine athletics by jumping and flipping for Frisbees at 2:30 p.m.

Concluding the featured presentations will be the annual stray pet contest for adopted dogs sponsored by People for Animals, to be held at 4:30 p.m. Prizes will be awarded for best trick, fastest tail wagger and other events. Entrees will be accepted until 3:30 p.m. that day for a nominal fee.
