All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted. <b>Section 9.</b> To finance said purposes, bond anticipation notes of said Town of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$906,900 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding. <b>Section 10.</b> Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said bond anticipation notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Town and attested by the Town Clerk or Deputy Town Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law. <b>Section 11.</b> It is hereby determined and declared that the average period of usefulness of said purposes, according to their reasonable lives, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds or notes authorized for said purposes, is a period of 10.73 years computed from the date of said bonds. <b>Section 12.</b> It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Town Clerk of said Town, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Town, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$906,900 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law. <b>Section 13.</b> Any funds received from the County of Union, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies (other than the State grant hereinbefore appropriated which shall be applied to the cost of such purposes, but shall not be applied to the payment of outstanding bond anticipation notes and the reduction of the amount of bonds authorized) or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purposes, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purposes, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purposes shall be reduced accordingly. <b>Section 14.</b> The Town intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Sections 1 and 4 of this bond ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Town, and the Town shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Town for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount. <b>Section 16.</b> The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Town Clerk and is available for public inspection. <b>Section 17.</b> This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage. 1 T - 5/9/02, The Leader Fee: \$409.02	<b>TOWN OF WESTFIELD</b> <b>BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS, THE ACQUISITION OF NEW ADDITIONAL OR REPLACEMENT EQUIPMENT AND MACHINERY, NEW ADDITIONAL FURNISHINGS AND NEW COMMUNICATION AND SIGNAL SYSTEMS EQUIPMENT AND THE RECONDITIONING OF A FIRE ENGINE IN, BY AND FOR THE TOWN OF WESTFIELD, IN THE COUNTY OF UNION, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$1,671,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO APPROPRIATE A STATE GRANT, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT OR FULLY FUND APPROPRIATIONS FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.</b> <b>BE IT ORDAINED</b> by the Town Council of the Town of Westfield, in the County of Union, State of New Jersey, as follows: <b>Section 1.</b> The Town of Westfield, in the County of Union, State of New Jersey (the "Town") is hereby authorized to make various public improvements, to acquire new additional or replacement equipment and machinery, new additional furnishings and new communication and signal systems equipment and to recondition a fire engine in, by and for said Town, as more particularly described in Section 4 hereof. The cost of the improvements includes all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor. <b>Section 2.</b> There is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Sections 1 and 4 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purposes"), the respective amounts of money hereinafter stated as the appropriation for said respective purposes. Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized, and the State grant and Capital Improvement Fund moneys (either to make a down payment or to fully fund appropriations) appropriated by this ordinance. Said improvements shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited. <b>Section 3.</b> It is hereby determined and stated that the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Town. <b>Section 4.</b> The several purposes hereby authorized for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued are set forth in the following "Schedule of Improvements, Purposes and Amounts" which schedule also shows (1) the amount of the appropriation and the estimated cost of each such purpose, and (2) the amount of each sum which is to be provided by the State grant hereinafter appropriated, and (3) the amount of each sum which is to be provided by the appropriation from the Capital Improvement Fund hereinafter made to either fully fund the appropriation or to provide a down payment, and (4) the estimated maximum amount of bonds and notes to be issued for each such purpose, and (5) the period of usefulness of each such purpose, according to its reasonable life, computed from the date of said bonds: <b>SCHEDULE OF IMPROVEMENTS, PURPOSES AND AMOUNTS</b> <b>A.</b> Undertaking of the following road improvements: (i) improvement of Lawrence Avenue, Section 1 (from Hillside Avenue to Mountain Avenue), including roadway resurfacing and curb replacement, where necessary, (ii) improvement of Scotch Plains Avenue (from W. Broad Street to Dartmoor), including roadway reconstruction, drainage improvements and replacement of existing concrete curb with granite block curb, (iii) improvement of Dudley Avenue (from Prospect Street to North Avenue), including roadway resurfacing and replacement of existing concrete curb with granite block curb, (iv) resurfacing of the Public Works Center Yard, (v) undertaking of various traffic calming improvements at various locations in the Town, as set forth on a list prepared by the Town Engineer on file or to be placed on file with the Town Clerk, and hereby approved as if set forth herein in full, and (vi) resurfacing or reconstruction of various roads (including curb construction or replacement, where necessary), as set forth on a list prepared by the Town Engineer on file or to be placed on file with the Town Clerk, and hereby approved as if set forth herein in full. Depending upon the contract price and other exigent circumstances, and upon approval by the Town Council, there may be additions to or deletions from the lists referred to in clauses (v) and (vi) of the preceding sentence. It is hereby determined and stated that said streets being improved are of "Class B" or equivalent construction as defined in Section 22 of the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law").
