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and that was the difference in the ballgame."

Coccoziello completed eight of 14 pass attempts for 122 yards, including a 63-yard strike to Tri-Captain/tight end Brian Butts in the second quarter.

"Jan created some plays. He scrambled and found a couple of guys. In his first start, you can see the athleticism," Tranchina pointed out. "It's going to be exciting. We've got to open him up a little more and take advantage of that."

Senior halfback Mike DeFazio rushed for 70 yards on 11 carries, senior Tri-Captain/fullback Pat Daly gained 46 yards on 13 carries and junior halfback Tyshon Blackmon rushed 27 yards on eight carries. Butts finished with three receptions

for 87 yards

Westfield looked impressive on its first series and marched the ball from its own 40 to the Ram 12 until Lessner booted a 22-yard field goal with 4:22 left in the first quarter. In that drive, DeFazio took the ball from the Ram 45 and moved it to the 15, then Blackmon pushed it to the 12 to set up the field goal.

The Rams took the kickoff and moved the ball to the Blue Devil 45 where it faced a fourth and one situation. On a fake punt, Trzesniowski made his crunching tackle and caused the ball to come loose where Daly pounced on it.

In the second quarter, on a third-and-nine, Blue Devil tackle Montell Glasco sacked the quarterback for a seven-yard loss.

On its next possession, Westfield was in cramped quarters at its own 19 until Coccoziello hit Butts for the 63-yard reception.

With 6:53 remaining in the third quarter, Brad Trzesniowski blocked the Rams' punt and Marc Dowling pounced on the ball at the 15. Two minutes later, Daly slanted from the six but fumbled into the end zone and Lessner recovered the ball to give Westfield a 9-0 lead. Lessner's PAT made it 10-0.

Midway through the final quarter, Coccoziello from his defensive back position read Rams quarterback Drew Willy and intercepted his pass along the sideline at the 23 and was knocked out of bounds at the 18. After gains of four, nine and five yards by Daly, DeFazio and Blackmon, respectively, Coccoziello pushed into the end zone from the two to up the lead to 17-0 with 3:32 left.

The Rams went into a passing mode and found success. Andrew Marge grabbed a TD pass with 2:26 on the clock, making the score 17-6. A two-point conversion failed. With 48 seconds remaining, Rocky D'Aconti added a one-yard TD reception to tighten the score to 17-12.

"We did better than I expected in terms of big mistakes," said Tranchina. "I don't think we turned the ball over once, which was wonderful."

The Blue Devils will play under the lights in Cranford tomorrow night at 7 p.m.
