The two division winners of the Union County Seniors 50+ Softball League went head-to-head in a one-game playoff, for the title of being the league champions. second goal came on a penalty kick with one minute remaining.

The teamwork between Schultz and Tomasso was quite evident. Throughout the game, their one-two punch agitated the Marauders' defense. Early in the first half, Schultz, on a direct kick, looped the ball over the Marauders' defensive wall as Tomasso slanted toward the goal. Later, Tomasso, on a direct kick returned the favor and hooked to Schultz. In the last five minutes of the first half, Westfield had three corner kicks in a row, two intended for Schultz, but the Marauders managed to dodge the crossfire. In the second half, a well-designed throw in from Schultz intended for Tomasso just missed the mark.

In addition to Schultz and Tomasso the entire Blue Devil striker force as well as the midfield outmatched the Marauders in team speed.

"We are happy with our strikers. We also have two very fast seniors in Ben Masel and Dan Lynes. So we have four kids up front who we are very, very happy with," expressed Kapner. "We also have a plethora of midfield players."

Thanks to the defensive stubbornness of junior sweeper Brendan Egan, Kane and junior Matt Sofka, the Blue Devils enjoyed controlling the ball in Marauder territory the majority of the game; however, there were some shaky instances. In the first half, a Marauder shot glanced off the post and, later, Sofka made a great defensive block. Senior goalkeeper Gil Arbitsman got pulled out of his goal position but Tucker filled in perfectly and rejected another shot. Midway through the second half, a Marauder shot bounced off the crossbar.

Arbitsman, who also wrestles and

plays lacrosse, played the first half and made four saves, one requiring an outstanding leap to his left. Junior Brian Pirot, who also is the goalkeeper on the ice hockey team and lacrosse team, played the second half and made three saves. Marauder goalie Ben Tamberella made seven saves in the first half and saved four in the second half although he was under constant attack.

With such athleticism, as with last year's North Jersey, Section 2 champions, the Blue Devils proved to be quite adaptable and capable of playing several positions.

"Every day in practice after the last scrimmage, my quote to the guys is 'if we were playing today, here is our lineup,' and it has changed after every scrimmage," Kapner pointed out. "One of the great things about coaching in public schools is this is who we have to work with. You can't go out and select a (position) player. We don't have a draft. These are the guys I have.
