and launched a left-footed shot into the upper left of the net for his first varsity goal.

"It was a good ball played through past the defender. I was running hard and I just let it go with my left foot," explained Young. "The goal keeper was out of place and it slid in on the left corner. It feels good!"

Early in the second half, with 31:15 on the clock, senior Ryan Breznitsky was awarded a penalty kick from about 12 yards out. Breznitsky made his approach and skid the ball into the lower right side of the net for the final goal.

Breznitsky, who has been extremely accurate with penalty kicks in his

four-year varsity experience, said, "I won't tell you I have any special spot in case any other teams read this. I just get up there and I try to read the keeper, basically, look at his eyes, see what his movements are. From that point on, I make my decision."

Breznitsky also had some good things to say about the play of freshman keeper Meredith. "I absolutely think he's earning his keep, seven games, seven shutouts. As a freshman, he's on the way to breaking all of Brad Lowyn's records. You can't ask for much more than that from a freshman goalkeeper."

As to his 34-yard touchdown run, Coccoziello chuckled and said, "Watching too much Michael Vick on TV."

Three fumbles, five interceptions

and several penalties dictated policy the entire second half, but the Blue Devils went with the flow and jammed the Bulldog offense. Coccoziello's second interception ended the Bulldogs' last attempt at a score.

"We've had a couple of close games. Last week was a bad game for us. There were a lot of injuries last week. It's not easy to come out and practice hard every day when you are 0-3, but I credit these kids for coming back," said Blue Devil Head Coach Ed Tranchina.
