## Library to Begin Registration Soon For Fall Kids' Programs

Crafts, for ages three to five, will be held on Fridays, October 17 to November 7. The maximum class number is 20 children, and an adult must accompany each child registered.

Participants may sign up for all programs at the library's Children's Desk. Sessions start promptly. These programs are offered to Scotch Plains residents who are library card holders.
