Woman's Club of Westfield Gives \$27,500 Scholarships

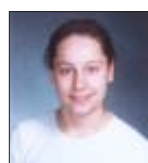
WESTFIELD — This year, the Woman's Club of Westfield has awarded a total of \$27,500 in scholarships.
