## Jay Cook Helps MSU Qualify For Division 3 World Series

Former Westfield High School graduate, Jay Cook, senior captain of the Montclair State University (MSU) baseball team, helped his team finish the regular season tied for first place with The College of New Jersey (TCNJ) and William Patterson in the New Jersey Athletic Conference

(NJAC). After falling to TCNJ in the championship tiebreaker, MSU received an at-large invitation for the NCAA Division 3 tournament.

TCNJ, Montclair, Kean University and Rowan University, all in the NJAC, qualified. TCNJ, Montclair and Kean were sent to the Mid-Atlantic Regional tournament held in Boyertown, PA, and Rowan was placed in the Southern Region, where they lost to North Carolina Wesleyan College in the final championship round.

Montclair lost its first game, but went on to sweep the losers' bracket in four straight games. Montclair then defeated TCNJ, 2-1 and 7-1, to advance to the NCAA Division 3 College World Series.

As team captain, Cook had the opportunity to showcase his talents as a gifted baseball player and as a human being. With a record of 5-3, he pitched against seven teams, ranked among the nation's top-20 Division 3 teams, including two losses to TCNJ. For the 2006-2007 academic year, MSU Head Coach Norm Schoenig asked Cook to work for him as an intern with the title, Student Assistant Coach.

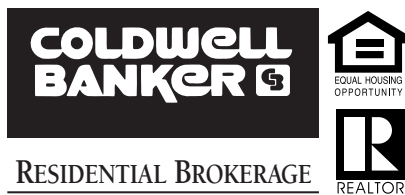
