SPF U13 Tempest Girls Win Mid-NJ Soccer Assn. Title

The Scotch Plains-Fanwood Tempest U13 girls soccer team won the Mid New Jersey Youth Soccer Association (MNJYSA) championship on June 16 by defeating Clark, 2-1. The Tempest, a Flight 2 team in the MNJYSA, reached the championship against Flight 1 Clark by defeating Cranford in the semifinals, 2-1. Against Clark, the Tempest defense, led by Meghan Cunningham, Kelsey Swintek, Alex Molinaro, Melaine Rome and goalie Paige Della Badia (two goals allowed in the two games) showed speed and skill in keeping a "bend but not break" mentality. Clark's only score came on a free kick halfway through the first half to make the score, 1-0. With eight minutes remaining, the Tempest evened the score, with Avika Shah finding the net after a beautiful pass from Emma Kelly. After steady pressure from Erica Randazzo,

Samantha Beller and Susan Shteyman, Evelyn Klotz moved with ball inside the 18-yard box and took her third hard foul of the game, resulting in a penalty kick for the Tempest, which just one minute left. Coach Luis Rodriguez, assisted by Sachin Shah and Tim Kelly, called on Lori Karabinchak to take the penalty kick. Though the Clark goalkeeper guessed correctly, Karabinchak drilled the shot to the upper left corner of the net to give the Tempest their first championship. Against Cranford, the Tempest scored first when Shah passed to Randazzo, who found the left side of the net. Tied at 1-1 in the second half, the winning goal came on Liz Tenzer's perfectly placed shot from the 18 with 10 minutes left to seal the game. Gabrielle Vacca, Nikki Appezzato and Michelle Rogoff played with their usual all out hustle to help secure the win.
