## CWC Announces 90th Year Scholarship Fund Appeal

WESTFIELD - In recognition of its 90th anniversary, the College Woman's Club (CWC) is conducting a town-wide appeal for scholarship funds to benefit young women from Westfield.

Letters were recently mailed to every household in Westfield with a return form for contributions. This is the first such appeal since the club's 80th anniversary in 1997 and will not be repeated until its centennial in 2017.

"We hope that Westfielders will respond generously to this once-a-decade request on behalf of so many deserving young women," said Dianne Callahan, CWC president. "The dream of higher education is one that our club has supported vigorously for nearly 100 years and should not be hindered by economic circumstance."

Founded in 1917 to promote higher education for women, the CWC has awarded hundreds of college grants to female graduates from Westfield High School. Scholarships are granted on the basis of academic achievement, financial need, leadership and character.

Funds for scholarships currently are drawn from members' dues, optional contributions, fundraisers and investment earnings. Monies received from the appeal will be used to strengthen the investment base of the CWC to help generate scholarships for years to come.

Last year, the CWC awarded a record \$40,000 in scholarship grants. According to the club, however, the number of applications received each year and the escalating costs of college demonstrate the need for additional and greater awards.

All contributions are fully tax-deductible and will be promptly ac-

knowledged and deposited in the year in which they are received. Additionally, the club invites all area women who are college graduates to become an active member of the CWC.
