## Grand Opening Held For Scotch Plains' First B&B

**SCOTCH PLAINS** – On November 22, 2008, the 1910 House Bed & Breakfast celebrated its grand opening with an open house from 1 until 5 p.m. After a brief "ribbon cutting," the 1910 House B&B was visited by many of the neighborhood residents, members of the township's zoning board and building department, local business people and representatives of local Channel 34.

The year-long journey began on a balcony of a Cape May Bed & Breakfast where the future innkeepers, Kathleen and Michael Tatsch, realized that they had a passion for owning and operating a bed & breakfast. After coming close to purchasing an existing B&B in northwest New Jersey, the couple just could not leave Scotch Plains where they have loved living for the last seven years and then decided to begin the process of turning their circa 1910 house into one. While Kathleen researched the process other aspiring innkeepers went through to open a new B&B, Michael began researching the local codes and zoning restrictions.

The first zoning board of adjustment presentation in January of this year produced many questions that required additional building code research and a second presentation in March, when their application received unanimous approval. While the house is a single-family residence, it had to be altered to allow use as a bed & breakfast, mainly providing a separate living space for the owners to live on the premises.

While the basement was finished to provide that space, most of the rest of the house has retained its original 1910 charm. The house has the original hardwood floors on the main floor, a

hot water heating system with exposed pipes and many ornate radiators produced by the American Radiator Company. Some of the walls and all ceilings still have the warmth of the latte and plaster construction so prevalent during the early 1900s.

As for the guests, the ground floor houses the common areas with a parlor, living room and dining room. Appointed with period pieces, these will take you back to the bygone days of the Edwardian Era. The second floor features a lovely shared hall bath with a cast iron claw foot tub and three themed guest rooms, The Crystal Room, The Harrison Fisher Room and The St. Bernard Room. The inspiration for The Crystal Room came from the dangling crystal prisms of the Art Deco ceiling fixture and this theme is carried throughout the entire room with the addition of Early American Pressed Glass and Brilliant Period Crystal Pieces.

The Harrison Fisher Room is named after the American Illustrator whose work adorns the room. The inspiration for The St. Bernard Room came from the antique art featuring the popular Victorian Era theme of children and St. Bernard dogs.

The location of the 1910 House Bed & Breakfast makes it a great choice for business travelers and people attending weddings, banquets, reunions, etc. Its setup is especially well suited for families and can make it a great place to place your overflow of out-of-town visitors at your next family gathering.

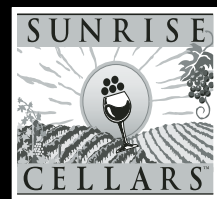
