CLARK - The Polish Cultural Foundation in Clark invites the public to come celebrate at its annual Polish Harvest Festival "Dozynki" on Sunday, September 20, at 3 p.m. There will be plenty of Polish ethnic food available, as well as an assortment of Polish beers and spirits at the cash bar. All are invited to attend this colorful event highlighting 1,000 years of Polish tradition.

The Polish American Folk Dance Company of Brooklyn, a group with a 70-year tradition of preserving Polish folk customs, will lead the festival program dressed in colorful, regional costumes. They will entertain all in their presentation of the harvest with folk dances and traditional couplets (humorous folk songs).

The Foundation encourages the public to wear a Polish costume, as well as to dress children in their costumes.

After the program, adults can enjoy dancing to the music of DJ Kaczynski, and children can play games under the auspices of the Polish Girl Scouts.

The Dozynki, or Harvest Celebration, is by far considered to be one of Poland's most revered traditions. For 1,000 years in Poland, the tenant farmers presented the Lord and the Lady of the Manor with gifts and garlands of wheat and wild flowers as part of a joyous fall celebration of the harvest. Throughout Poland's history, much importance was placed on the harvest because it represents the fruits of the farmers' labors, as well as their ability to sustain themselves throughout the

winter months. In gratitude, the "starosta," or Lord of the Manor, shares food, drink and music with his tenants. A procession of farmers with their implements, presenters and dancers in regional costumes accompanied by musicians will initiate the festival.

The festival consists of two parts: processional songs honoring the harvest that are solemn in nature and reaffirm the reverence of the tradition, and the general celebration during which the celebrants return dressed in holiday finery to sing, dance, feast and play games. Dozynki reminds people today of their inherent connection to the land and to nature itself. Dozynki celebrations vary from region to region.

The Polish Cultural Foundation is located at 177 Broadway in Clark, just off Exit 135 of the Garden State Parkway. Tickets for the festival are \$8 for adults and free for children under 12.

Elizabeth M. Davidson, 87, died on Tuesday, August 18, 2009, in Bridgewater, N.J.

She helped organize her 40th and 50th high school reunions. Mrs. Davidson also was instrumental in the establishment of a bronze plaque at Town Hall in memory of the Westfield servicemen who lost their lives in World War II.

Mrs. Davidson was proud of the fact that her daughter Margaret was the fourth-generation attorney in the family. The others include Mrs. Davidson's grandfather, George Blank; her father-in-law, Cuddie E. Davidson, and her husband, Cuddie E. Davidson, Jr.

A memorial service will be held for Mrs. Davidson at 10 a.m. on Monday, September 14, at the Chapel of The Presbyterian Church in Westfield. Burial will be private.
