We are human, but we get along very well. We had a nice season. We were in the finals. We were third-seeded. We had to play Awnings Galore. We lost to them 1-0, and the [two] victories were by one run also. It was an exciting series. I always say to the guys that we are fortunate that we can run around at this age. I'm 63; playing in the 50's [league]."

Tony Williams contributed a single and two runs to Renda Roads' 24-hit shelling. Powerhouse Dave Lavelle battered a pair of two-run doubles and an RBI single, while scoring three times. Frank Pepe (2 RBI) and Joe Massimino (double) each had three hits and scored twice. Keith Gibbons (2 RBI, triple), Ed Belford (RBI triple), Pat Nigro (RBI double) and Lou Balestriere each had a pair of hits and scored once. Larry Esolda rapped a two-run double, tripled and scored twice. Tom Straniero singled and scored twice, and Tom Baldowski tripled.

Kulik led the Brew Crew's 17-hit response, going 3-for-3, with a walk, two RBI and two runs scored. Neil Iaccarino doubled, singled twice and scored three times. Geno Antonucci had three RBI and a single. Joe Viso singled twice and scored twice. Don Montefusco (RBI) and George Brokaw each singled twice and scored once.

Greg Hartnett, Bob Lieberman, Bob D'Meo and Gary Capaldo each singled. Straniero kindled a five-run first inning with a single to right field, but Esolda and Lavelle set it ablaze with their back-to-back two-run doubles. Kulik singled and scored on Antonucci's groundout in the bottom of the inning. In the second, Viso singled and later scored when Kulik drew a bases-loaded walk.

The Roadmen tarred the Brew Crew in the third inning with a six-run coating to grab an 11-2 lead. Lavelle yanked his second two-run double to left. Pepe peppered an RBI single. Gibbons cracked an RBI triple. Nigro sliced an RBI double, and Brian Williams plopped an RBI single over first.

Belford slashed an RBI triple, and Massimino muscled an RBI single in the fourth to up the lead to 13-2. Iaccarino doubled and scored in the bottom of the inning, but Esolda tripled, and Lavelle followed with an RBI single in the fifth.

Straniero scored in the sixth to give the Roadsters a 15-3 lead, but the Crew brewed up five runs on five hits to put the Roadmen on edge, as they came to bat in the seventh. Gibbons and Brian Williams tapped RBI singles for some more cushion.

Only fitting, Tony Williams, from his shortstop position, initiated a short-to-second-to-first double play to get the first two outs in the seventh, then on the next play, he grabbed a grounder and fired to first to allow Renda Roads to complete its trip to an undefeated season.

## Blue Devil Footballers Make Shifts on 'O' Line, Backfield

Last year, the Blue Devils got great contributions from receiver Pat Gray, who has graduated. Senior Ryan Hess, a star on the basketball team who did not play football last year, will set up at split end. Senior Pat Bergin and junior James O'Rourke will also be in the mix. At flanker will be junior Pete Ondi, and at tight end will be junior John Lanzano.

"We have Hess, Ondi, Bergin and O'Rourke. Those are the four guys who are going to have to replace a lot of production. I like what they bring to the table. Ryan played football as a sophomore. We just have to get him game-ready and back into the swing of things. Pete is fast, a tough kid on the outside," coach DeSarno noted.

The offensive line, "is a senior-dominated line, but they are very inexperienced. We have got to get them to learn the speed of a varsity game. There's a big difference between JV and varsity. I am happy with their effort. We are coming along," coach DeSarno said.

Chris Mannino and co-captain Jesse DeMartino will play left guard and right guard, respectively. The center is Tony Mastrocola. But senior left tackle/defensive end Nick Matthews, a starter last year, should add some leadership.

"He's had a great summer and a very good pre-season. He's been a tight end, but we felt he would help our team better at tackle," commented DeSarno.

DeMartino and Ryan Elliott will be the defensive tackles. Lanzano and junior Brendan Dugan are the outside linebackers. Murray and junior James McCrea are the inside linebackers. O'Rourke and Ondi will be at the corners, and Bergin will be at free safety. Since many of the Blue Devils will be also playing on defense, conditioning is of the ut-

most importance.

"We work hard on conditioning. That's the point of emphasis, but we also have guys who are second teamers right now who we want to get out there. We want them to challenge the starters," said DeSarno. "We do have some really nice sophomores. Ryan Esposito, as a linebacker, has really opened our eyes. Brenton Harries is an offensive tackle and a defensive tackle, who has really done some great things at camp. Mark Frega! He's a wrestler. He's a beast of a player. He's going to help us down the line, and Tim Walsh is going to help us."

One area in which the Blue Devils are expected to be very strong will be located at the foot of junior John Gribbin, who will kick the extra points, as well as kick off.

"Trying to get a good kicker in high school is hard. We are lucky to have John. Don't be surprised if you see him out there playing a little bit. He's got good hands. He's a good receiver. I like the fact that he is an athlete, not just a kicker," DeSarno said.

Junior Geoff Scognamiglio will handle the punting duties. "[With] the work he's put in at the weight room, kicking, going to camps, he came back a whole new player," DeSarno said.

O'Rourke and Ondi will handle the kickoff and punt returns.

With an opening game at Scotch Plains-Fanwood on Saturday, September 11, at 1 p.m., the Blue Devils know they better be ready for action.

"We've got to come out of the gates flying," coach DeSarno said. "If you are not focused for that one, it's going to slip by you. It's been a point of emphasis. We let the game come to us instead of attacking the games early in the year last year. We can't afford to do that."

## Golf Professional Suggests 'Drill Baby, Drill' - in Golf

These words are not a political statement, but relative to golf, a strong suggestion of what it takes to achieve a better result from your training sessions.

Watching Tiger lately is a study in what it takes to get out of a slump. Essentially, he has gone back to his early fundamentals. His new swing coach Sean Foley is working on his backswing. Interesting for the No. 1 player in the world to be breaking it down this way.

To improve his motion, Tiger is using a drill designed specifically for achieving his improvement. In a sense, it is a skills challenge, which initially may be difficult to perform and, once mastered, would ensure a better posi-

tion for him to improve consistency and, perhaps, his ultimate comeback.

Pictured here is my favorite drill given to my students, as it essentially guarantees the quality of the impact position. Very few of my students perform the drill well initially; however, with continued use, the drill will help improve the quality of the shot.

I invite you to make an appointment with me, as fall is approaching to take your game to the next level. A famous instructor's words of wisdom have suggested that it is a great idea to learn skiing in the summer and golf in the winter.
