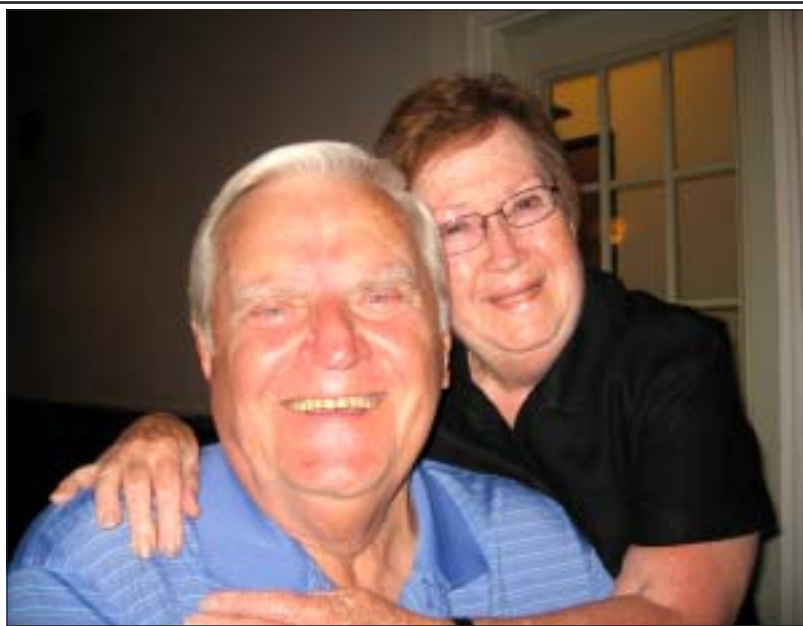
Temple Sholom Plans Congregational Seder
