

Cougar Girls Finish Second Devil Boys 3rd at UCT Relay

The Cranford High School girls indoor track team finished second with 39 points, and the Westfield High School boy tied for third with 34 points at the Union County Relays held at the Jersey City Armory on January 10. Summit won the girls race with 51 points, and Union Catholic won the boys race with 59 points. The Scotch Plains-Fanwood girls placed fourth with 27 points.

Cougars Kate Burns, Megan Schetelich, Rebecca Shimonov and Natalie Englese crossed third in the 4x200 with a time of 1:52.02. Blue Devils Ashley Edwards, Hannah Kronick, Sam Costello and Sirena VanEpp finished fifth at 1:55.28. Evans, Schetelich, Shimonov and Englese placed third in the 4x400 at 4:20.57, while Costello, Kronick, VanEpp and Edwards finished sixth at 4:28.06.

Blue Devils Kaitlyn Johnson, Eileen Cook, Gabrielle Tonji and Alyssa Hatch took sixth in the 4x800 at 10:56.16. SPF Raiders Isabel Crystal, Christine Miklas, Emily Nagourney and Erin Pierce placed second in the sprint medley relay (SMR) at 4:32.36. The Raiders also placed second in the distance medley relay (DMR) at 13:15.79, and the Cougars took sixth 13:37.93.

going to come out stronger to make up for our loss today."

"He did not listen to what we told him to do. Half nelson! We told him to stay with that series," Blue Devil Head Coach Glen Kurz said.

Blue Devil heavyweight Kyle Kania did the expected with a 3:52 fall over Ryan Farrell when he turned him with a three-quarter nelson. The Blue Devils increased their team lead to 21-4 when Brendan Currie pinned Ryan Espuga with a wristlock and half nelson in 1:47 at 103 lbs.

The stunner came next! Undefeated Blue Devil Mike Kalimtzis, a Union County and District 12 champion at 103 lbs. last year, bumped up to 112 lbs. to face Mike Helmstetter, who had defeated him in a dual match last year. Kalimtzis turned Helmstetter to his back with a wristlock/half nelson, but Helmstetter threw a hard bridge and turned the tables for a four-point move. In the third period, Helmstetter controlled Kalimtzis from the top position and added a penalty point to win, 5-3.

"He and I have a long history together, so we have been going back and forth. It was a really close match right up to the end," Helmstetter said. "He caught me on my back then I used all the strength I could so I could bridge and flip him over right to his back. Coach said I'm doing well riding the guy out, so I stuck with that."

"We knew that was going to be a big match. He [Kalimtzis] wrestled tough. I think it is just a clash in styles," Coach Torsone said.

"He had the kid on his back. That's a nine-point swing, but it wouldn't have mattered. As a team, we didn't show up today," Coach Kurz said. "No heart! No fire! No enthusiasm! Making such dumb mistakes!"

The very next bout proved that the tide had shifted to the Cougars, when Cory Birch took Nick Velez straight to the mats and clamped him in a

cradle in 33 seconds at 119 lbs.

At 125 lbs., Cougar Joe Giaccio picked up his 102nd career win with a tight waist stack pin in 43 seconds over Anthony Aldano. Cougar Ian Henry followed with a 3:15, head smother fall over Pat Currie at 130 lbs., and Kyle Markovitch scored a takedown in the final second to claim a 9-1 majority decision over Nick Rotondo at 135 lbs. to give the Cougars a 29-21 lead.

Blue Devil Ellis Opoku slowed down the bleeding with a 3-0 win over Eric Knight at 140 lbs., but Cougar Matt DiGiovanni recorded three takedowns and an escape to earn a 7-1 decision over Troy Skibitsky at 145 lbs. Down 32-24 with two bouts remaining, the Blue Devils still had an outside chance of pulling out the team victory, but Cougar Jim Dwyer scored an escape in the third period to eke out a 1-0 decision over Colin Barber at 152 lbs.

"Jimmy seemed like he wanted it out there on the mat today. He went out there and showed a lot of heart, a lot of guts. He went after him. He didn't back down," Coach Torsone said.

In the final bout at 160 lbs., Corey Markovitch scored five points in the third period to grab an 11-6 decision over Blue Devil Brian Bulger.

"The swing bouts were obviously Mike Helmstetter and Cory Birch getting a pin for us. Getting bonus points as a freshman in a big match like this was huge. There were a lot of swing bouts, and tonight we won the ones that could have gone in their favor."
