GREEN, McGUIRE LEAD JUMPS; HOWARD DISTANCE

Cougar Track Boys Feel They Are Loaded with Experience

Huge numbers of personnel and a large group of returning veterans may push this year's Cranford High School boys track & field team along the road to a very successful season.

The Cougar boys may not have made as big a blip on the radar screen last year as the Cougar girls have, but this season they have a massive turnout of personnel, including several athletes from the 2011 State Sectional Championship football team, to add to that experience.

"I really do think we have a great team this year. We are loaded with experience. We have lots of seniors, in addition to have some great newcomers, who are really contributing right away," Cougar Head Coach Kerry Drexler said.

The Cougar boys placed seventh at the North Jersey, Group 3, Section 2 Track & Field championships last year but have more depth across the board and a pair of workhorses who have and will excel in the jumping events and some running events. Last year, senior Adham McGuire leapt

42-7.75 and junior Reggie Green soared 42-9.5 to place second at the Union County Relays.

McGuire and Green may also be lining up to start the 100 and 200 meters, along with junior Evan Zoughy and sophomore Jake Waleski. They may also compete in the high jump, and McGuire and Zoughy will compete in the long jump.

"Reggie and Adham, right now, are the two school record holders in the triple jump. Adham indoors and Reggie outdoors. Adham is only an inch behind Reggie's best jump outdoors. Those two are competing to see who is going to be the best in school history in addition to seeing who is going to be the best in the county," Coach Drexler said.

At the UCT individual meet last year, McGuire placed sixth in the javelin with a toss of 144-4.

"Adham is one of our best javelin throwers in addition to the fact that they are our best sprinters, so we can put them where we want. They are definitely going to be the guys, who are going to carry our team by doing four events each," Coach Drexler said.

Senior Chris Witwick and junior Rob Kessler will also toss the javelin.

Kessler, sophomore Rob O'Shaughnessy and senior Greg Miller will compete in the discus. O'Shaughnessy and seniors TJ Nichols and JD Foye will shove the shot put.

We have experienced throwers with Chris Witwick throwing the javelin. Robbie Kessler is throwing multiple events. Rob O'Shaughnessy is throwing multiple events. Nichols is leading us in the shot put. So we have a lot of guys, who have already contributed before, and they are doing a great job right now," Coach Drexler said.

The Cougars also have a very strong pole vaulter in sophomore Pat Lynch. Junior Mike Helms and sophomore Dan Hannen will add depth to the event.

Witwick, senior Carl Lieberman and sophomore Joe DaSilva will compete in the 400, with seniors George El-Khoury and Mike Zanfardino, and sophomore Paul Cassero competing in the 800 and 1,600. That group may also compete in the 4x400. Witwick and senior Dan VanOstenbridge are expected to run the 400 hurdles.

The Cougars have a host of additional seasoned athletes competing in the distance events (1,600 & 3,200) with seniors Eli Howard and Tom Feeney, and sophomores Brendan Donovan and Connor McMahon. "Our seniors are always led by our distance guys with Eli Howard, George El-Khoury, Paul Cassaro and Tom Feeney. In addition, we have great field events with Reggie Green, Adham McGuire. They are able to do just about any event that we put them in. I really think that we going to try our best to make a run for the county relays. Last year, we looked at it and said we got a shot. This year, we are better than we were last year," Coach Drexler said.

"All of our local rivals are always tough. Johnson, Westfield! Those two games should be wars. Scotch Plains is ever improving, and they really want to get a good victory against us. The conference is even stronger. They brought in Morristown. You have a

broken leg.

"We've got all of those defenders back. Unfortunately, we graduated our goaltender, so we have had a search on for his replacement, and I think we've got a pretty good one in Wills Roman. Jack Davis had a broken leg through most of pre-season. He's just getting back with the team now. We are hoping he can get to 100 percent then we can have healthy competition to get both guys better," Coach Reinoso said.

The midfield seems to be of some

The attack force consists of junior three-year starter and three-sport athlete, Tom Fitzgerald, senior Andrew DeLuca and junior Dan Murphy. Rubin will also be a threat from the midfield. Most teams will be keying on Fitzgerald.

very strong Millburn team, a very strong St. Peter's team, and very strong Montclair Kimberly team that is the defending champion of the division. So it's very strong top to bottom. I expect it to be a dogfight in the county and also in the Waterman Division," Cougar Head Coach Al Reinoso said.

That can keep all teams in the dogfights is a strong defense.

"That was the case last year. We built up our defense, and most of our success was generated out of our strong goaltending, strong defensive play and good face-off play. A lot of possessions come from that. That's going to be our formula, hopefully, this year," Coach Reinoso said.

The Cougars have a veteran defensive crew with senior Alex Fries and juniors Jon Dinsmore and Jack Nunziata, and with senior Owen Dingelstedt as the first defender off the bench. Sophomore Wills Roman has acquired the goalkeeper position, especially since junior Jack Davis has been recovering from a

concern, but there are a few veterans returning, led by senior Jonathan Rubin. Seniors Matt Bowman and Glen Cook, and junior Stefan Fedorchak will be in the midfield. Junior Joe Vicci will take the face-offs. Senior Dan Weber will be the long-stick middle. Other middies are junior Shane Albrecht and Cam Kutzer.

"That's our work in progress. Our midfield and goaltending is our most untested. They have to work hard in order to get to the level of our defense and our attack. We didn't lose anybody on defense and we graduated only one attackman. The midfielders have to really buy in and really work hard if we are able to be successful this year," Coach Reinoso said.

He had a nice preseason, really distributing the ball more. He is seeing the field better," Coach Reinoso said.

But opposing teams should not neglect Murphy and DeLuca.

"We got a nice pleasant surprise with the advancement of Dan, a big tall strong lefty, and Andrew has rounded into a nice attackman. Each guy does a little something different, and that's what the challenge is right now, trying to blend those ingredients," Coach Reinoso said.

The Cougars jumped into the fire immediately when they faced the Westfield Blue Devils on April 2 and suffered a 10-3 setback. The Cougars will travel to Scotch Plains this Saturday to face an improved Raider squad at 11 a.m.


