# Blue Devils Down Plainfield, Rahway in Boys, Girls Track

The Westfield High School boys and girls track & field teams opened the season with dominating victories over Rahway and Plainfield at Hub Stine Field in Plainfield on April 2. The boys topped Plainfield, 91-47, and Rahway, 93-46, while the girls

recorded eight sweeps against the Cardinals and Indians and seized respective wins of 93-28 and 98-24. The Blue Devil boys swept four events, beginning with the 800 meters when Kevin Smith crossed in 2:05.8, followed by Matt Luppino at 2:05.9

and Dan Luzzi at 2:10.7. Rob Marcyzdylo at 4:47.8, Mike Reilly at 4:58.2 and Dalton Herzog at 5:00.6 swept the 1,600. Sid Douglas with a leap of 19-8, Peter Fagan at 19-6 and Jon Savorgiannakis at 18-1 swept the long jump. Peter Foltz with a height of 11-6, Nick Carayannopoulos at 10-0 and Chase Skibitsky at 10-0 swept the pole vault.

Savorgiannakis took first in the triple jump with a distance of 39-0.75. Max Bohall won the javelin with a toss of 124-11. Douglas won the 200 in 23.8 and took third in the 100 at 11.5. Frankie Pinney placed third in the 400 hurdles at 62.9. Joe Obiajulu took second in the high jump with a height of 6-0.

Smith at 51.7 and Adam Lupicki at 53.3 took 1-2 in the 400. Lupicki, Obiajulu, Luppino and Smith finished first in the 4x400 at 3:37.5.

For the girls, Sophia Goldschmidt at 13.4, Jenna Helfand at 13.4 and Elise Ballan at 14.0 swept the 100 meters. Helfand and Goldschmidt at 28.0 and Anna Browne at 28.3 swept the 200. Goldschmidt at 1:04, Sam Bromberg at 1:06 and Browne at 1:07.7 swept the 400.

Meghan O'Dwyer at 2:38.4, Lily Burtness at 2:38.5 and Natalie Marcotullio at 2:39.1 swept the 800. Johanna Mermer at 5:57.4, O'Dwyer at 5:57.4 and Gabrielle Brennan at 6:03.8 swept the 1,600. Mermer at 12:34.7 and Charlie O'Brien at 13:41.5 took 1-2 in the 3,200. Meghan Reilly with a toss of 114-4, Christina Mosco at 94-3 and Emily Mastrocola at 82-0 swept the javelin.

Hannah Hawkins with a jump of 15-10, Burtness at 15-3 and Marcotullio at 14-2 swept the long jump. Mae Devin with a height of 8-0, Alex Kapadia and Ida Chen at 6-6 swept the pole vault. Reilly won the discus with a throw of 79-0. Veronica Murphy finished third in the 100 hurdles at 19.1. O'Dwyer, Bromberg, Marcotullio and Burtness finished first in the 4x400 at 4:30.57.

# Cougar Tracksters Tune Up In Meet with Hillside Comets

Opening day at Memorial Field in Cranford in a non-scorekeeping meet against the Hillside Comets on April 3 gave the Cranford High School girls and boys track & field teams and coaches some insight in which events might be best suited for their new personnel.

The majority of the Cougar veteran runners, throwers and jumpers competed in just a few events, while the primary concentration appeared to be focused on the freshmen and sophomore competitors.

"It's only early April, which means I don't know where the new faces fit in yet to our varsity line ups. I do however, love seeing all of the new people out and working hard and competing for spots. Our coaching staff makes it very clear that your performances speak for themselves. The best times/jumps/marks will compete for us at the varsity level and our goal is to win championships," Cougar girls Head Coach Peter Kane said.

Placements were not necessarily the focus but early-season times were. Junior Ashley McGuire did cross first in the 100 meters with a time of 12.87, while junior Jenna Ellenbacher finished in 12.97. McGuire also crossed the line in the 200 meters at 27.6, followed by Ellenbacher at 28.07. Senior Bryanna Grant finished the 100-hurdles in 16.07, while McGuire and junior Kate Dezer crossed in 19.37. Junior Laura Van Horn ran the 400-hurdles in 1:13.57 and Ellenbacher

finished in 1:15.29. Running for warm-up, senior Katia Oltmann and Amanda Bush finished the 3,200 meters side-by-side at 14:11. Sophomore Keara Reilly and freshman Katie Dreniak completed the 1,600 in 6:09 and 6:30, respectively. Kelly Schoustra finished the 800 in 2:58, while Claire Dreniak and Lyndsay Pace both crossed in 3:08.

Junior Alex Krowicki tossed the javelin a distance of 103-0.5 and the

shot put 26.775. Lauren Klecker tossed the discus 65-10. Senior Regine Hunter had a leap of 16-4 and McGuire went 15-1 in the long jump. Grant had a distance of 34-0 in the triple jump.

"The girls are working hard and we are looking to put together the best lineups that help Cranford win. April is a continual work in progress, so that we can peak at the right times later in the season when it comes to

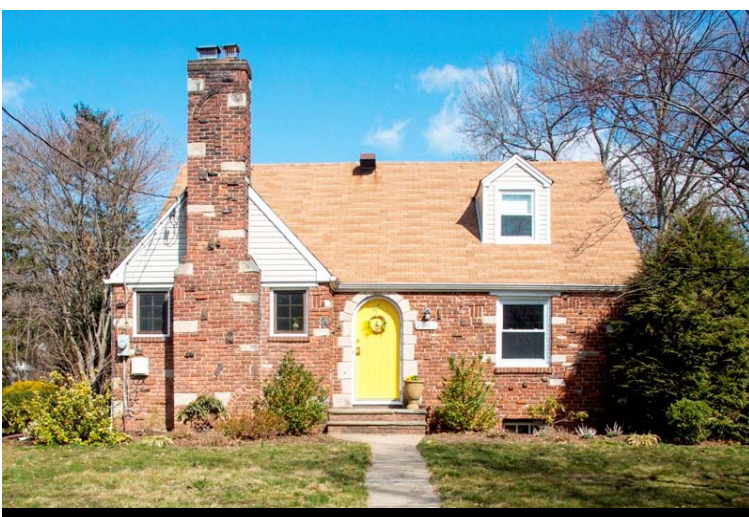
