Raider Footballers to Focus Offense on Speed, Quickness

Changes have been made in this year's Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School football team's offense to better suit the abilities of its personnel, who can no longer rely on a sizeable line to open holes for the running backs.

"We think we have some nice weapons. We changed our offensive philosophy. We were 'Multiple I' for 20-some odd years, an offense that did a lot of great things, but we don't have the muscle to get people out of the way the same way. We have speed. We have guys, who are quick, and

fense for the advantage of Emendo, who came on last year and rushed for over 400 yards. With Kobe White, I think we have a nice 1-2 punch with the read option. It will make it difficult for teams to defend," Coach Stack said.

Junior Ryan Jensen and sophomore Mike Dwunfour will be the tight ends. Seniors Owen Monahan and Joe Pagano are expected to be the starting wide receivers; however, several players will rotate in and out, including juniors Jordan Jones, Merlin Edmund and Cameron Smith.

"We are also looking to throwing a lot more jet sweeps, taking advantage

Coach Stack said, "Sam was inside last year. He will be our strong-side outside linebacker. He wants to react. He wants to be physical. Our weak side outside linebacker is Ryan Jensen, also returning. Big body!"

The Raiders have several personnel for the corner positions, including juniors Andrew Ciccarino and Edmund. Pagano will be the safety with senior Charles Taylor as a solid backup.

that's what we are going to take advantage of," Raider Head Coach Jon Stack said.

That transition actually began midway through last season when Coach Stack shifted the quarterback responsibilities to Emendo Thomas, then a sophomore. This season, Thomas will be working with tailbacks Kobe White, a junior, and senior Sam McQuoid, who from time-to-time will occupy the fullback position. Junior Kevin Maxwell will also be at the fullback position. Sophomore Marquel Taylor will be the backup quarterback.

"We have a young team this year. Only five seniors, who are going to be starting. [We have] a lot of juniors. We are putting in a read option of-

of some of our more speedy guys. Jordan, a speedy wide receiver, Cameron, Merlin Edmund. We have two nice tall outside receivers, Joe Pagano and Owen Monahan. Owen, Joe and Emendo had worked together coming up with some different routes. They are big targets, not to mention they block downfield," Coach Stack pointed out.

The offensive line consists of sophomore left tackle Rashan Gary, junior left guard Mike Daszyk, junior center Todd Ryan and some others, junior right tackle Pierce Johnston and senior right guard Nick Hall.

"We have a very young line. Guys who were tight ends before, now being put to the guard spot. We had three 300-pounders on the 'O' line. We definitely lost that, but what the guys are doing so far, they are faster, they get on their blocks and they do a lot of nice position blocks that we are very happy with," Coach Stack said.

On defense, Gary [6'4" 280-lbs] will plug up holes as the nose guard; however, he may also be shifted along the line to confuse opponents. Dwunfour will be at left end, Hall at tackle and Daszyk will be at right end. Maxwell and junior Brendan Kelly will be the middle linebackers.

"We have Rashan. He's going to play nose. He's going to play D-end on both sides. The whole idea with him is we don't want other teams getting the idea where they are going to double team him. We are going to move him around and take advantage of his athleticism. Rashan makes other players better. Nick Hall is looking great. The two of them are a big force. Then behind them we have Kevin Maxwell, who is the leader on our defense. He plays sideline-to-side-

corners are Andrew and Merlin, but we can put Emendo, Kobe, a new senior Andy Xu, Cameron, Jordan. We like to rotate corners for coverage, keep their bodies fresh," Coach Stack explained.

The punting responsibilities have been delegated to Jones. The Raiders are still working with the kickoffs, but Ciccarino is a possible candidate.

The Raiders will open their season at Governor Livingston on Thursday, September 12, at 4 p.m.
