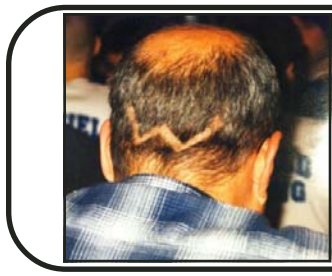
UC Viking Boys/Girls Win Three Events Each at MOC
