## Mudturtles Win 4th Straight N.J. State Rugby Crown

The Union County Mudturtles followed up their National Tier II Tournament Championship of a few weeks ago by winning the New Jersey State Championship on June 8. The Mudturtles defeated Morris County, 36-10, at the Caven Point Athletic Center in Jersey City.

Senior Nick Costa started the scoring early in the first half by blasting his way into the try zone. He took a pass from Kevin Trotter after Trotter had a nice open field 40-yard run. Play went back and forth for the next 10 minutes until Brendan Cunningham escaped down the right sideline for a 30-yard run and as he was tackled, made a nifty pass to Nick Ballas, who went in for the try.

Morris answered with a try to make the score, 10-5. Jatece Wright countered by using his blazing speed to run around and through all 15 Morris players down the left sideline for a 60-yard try. Michael Dabulas converted the kick to put Union up, 17-5. The game became very physical and the Mudturtles had a 10 minute goal stand with Brendan Collum and Matt Zimmerman both making tackles all over the field. With five minutes to go

in the half, Mike Hogan was sent off on a penalty. The first half ended with Costa making goal line tackle and Dabulas booting a gorgeous 50 yarder to get Union out of trouble.

The second half started slowly until Wright had another 60-yard run for a try that included some Barry Sanders-like moves. Dabulas made the conversion to bring the score to 24-5. The score remained the same for 10 minutes as Dabulas, Costa, Collum, Zach Koch, Mike Hogan, Tom Morley and the Mudturtle squad made things very difficult for Morris. Ben Kelly then scored for Union on a fake pitch keeper down the middle to make score 31-10.

Wright finished up scoring with his third try of the match by running down a long Trotter kick that stayed in bounds. Wright stole the ball away from a Morris player and scooted into try zone. Fred Gladis, Jack Dabulas, Khalil Burns, Joe Sichel, Pat Hak, Terece Johnson, Mike Sullivan and Hendrix Vernot all also made significant contributions for the Mudturtles making Union the New Jersey State Champions for the fourth consecutive year.
