WF Girls 4x800, Boys 4x400 Get 2nd at Group 4 Track

The Westfield High School girls placed second in the 4x800 relay and the Blue Devil boys finished second in the 4x400 relay at the Group 4 Track & Field Championships held at Franklin Township High School in Somerset on May 31 and June 1. The top-8 in each event would advance to the Meet of Champions held at North Burlington High School this Saturday, June 8.

For the girls, Blue Devils Caroline Collins, Isabel Boufarah, Katie Hamilton and Sarah Hacker turned in a time of 9:18.6 to finish second in the 4x800. Hamilton also finished third in the 1,600 with a time of 4:53.16. Blue Devil Sam Stravach placed fourth in the javelin with a toss of 124-1 and Scotch Plains-Fanwood Raider Olivia Fletcher placed 17th with a toss of 101-5. Stravach also placed seventh in the discus with a toss of 112-8.

Blue Devil Lauren Triarsi finished eighth in the 100-hurdles with a time of 15:08. Julia Csorba finished eighth in the 400-hurdles at 1:04.04. SPF Raiders Che Dashiell placed eighth in

the high jump with a clearance of 5-4, Julia Jackson finished ninth in the 400 at 57.34 and Corinne Lyght finished 13th in the 100 at 12.59. Although not placing in the top-8, Blue Devils Csorba, Hamilton, Sofia Pappalardo and Caroline Bielen finished 10th in the 4x400 with a time of 3:57.02.

In the boys' events, Blue Devils Jake Saltzer, Ajay Olson, Steve Zucker and Will Surks finished second in the 4x400 with a time of 3:17.7. Blue Devils Will Loggia, Ronnie Melao, James McCutcheon and Cooper Brennan crossed third in the 4x800 with a time of 7:59.88.

Raider Jacob Leigh finished third in the 100 dash with a time of 10.84. Leigh also finished third in the 200 at 21.94 with Olson taking 10th at 22.51. He then finished fifth in the 400 at 48.39 with Saltzer finishing seventh at 48.98 and Olson crossing 10th at 49.15.

Raider Kyle Estivene finished sixth in the 110-hurdles at 14.71 and Ben Fleischer crossed eighth in the 3,200 at 9:33.06 with Blue Devils Loggia and Jack Maranz finishing 15-16. Blue

Devil Griffin Rooney took sixth in the javelin with a toss of 166-2 and Jeremy Kronheimer took eighth at 159-7, while teammate Tom Davis placed 15th at 153-7. Blue Devil Quinn Priscoe took ninth in the long jump with a leap of 21-3.25 and Raider Justin Williams finished 14th in the 400-hurdles at 56.52. Blue Devil Declan McCauley placed 19th in the discus with a toss of 127-6.

At the Group 3 Championship in Bayville, Cranford Cougar Sasha Knapp placed sixth in the long jump with a personal-best leap of 17-9.5 and teammate Cielo Tumbokon placed 19th at 15-11. Knapp also placed eighth in the triple jump with a distance of 35-10.5. Hannah Capone tied for 12th in the pole vault with a height of 9-6.

For the boys, Cougar Matt Maggio finished 17th in the 200 at 23.09 and Jack Bowers had a shove of 46-4 to place 18th in the shot put. Summit Hilltoppers Ahmad Samuels, Maxim Yorkov, Luke Mauriello and Jacob Pantoya finished third in the 4x800 with a time of 8:03.91.

No. 4 Ridgewood Nine Stops Blue Devils in Group Semi, 6-1

A magical run finally came to an end at Kean University in Union on June 3. The Westfield High School baseball Blue Devils, fresh off running the table to win their second straight North Jersey, Section 2, Group 4 title, dropped a 6-1 decision to the No. 4 ranked Ridgewood Maroon in the Group 4 semifinal. Ridgewood had previously won the North Jersey, Section 1, Group 4 title by outscoring their four opponents, 44-3.

Ridgewood starter Sam Favieri was on the mound until he reached his pitch-count limit with one out in the seventh inning and was relieved by Matt Crawford. Favieri literally scattered six hits — no more than one in any given inning — hit a batter and permitted just one walk, while striking out six Blue Devils.

Blue Devil starter Mike Carlone pitched until he was relieved by Christopher Ho with one out in the fifth inning. Carlone yielded nine hits and four walks, while striking out seven. Ho retired five of the six batters he

faced, striking out four and walking one.

"Going into this game they have outscored their opponents 44-3, and they have scored 14, 11, 12, 10. They just smashed the ball. I thought Carlone did a great job, kept them off-balance. A couple of balls dropped in places where we couldn't get them and that's how it goes," Blue Devil Head Coach Bob Brewster explained.

The 11-12 Blue Devils recorded the first hit of the game when Andrew Caminiti chopped a one-out infield single toward third base in the top of the first inning but Sean Flynn rapped a sharp grounder to first baseman Mike Breitner, who stepped on the bag and threw in time to second for the double play. Ho bounced a one-out single up the middle in the second inning but Favieri got the next two batters out.

Ridgewood took a 3-0 lead in the bottom of the second inning. Brian Skettini drew a leadoff walk then after Carlone struck out the next two

batters, Breitner (2-for-2, walk) slashed an RBI double to leftfield. Reed Darienzo (2-for-3) yanked an RBI double down the right field line then advanced to third on a wild pitch. Carlone walked Matt Favieri, putting runners on first and third. As Favieri attempted to steal second, the Blue Devils tried to pull off a cut play to catch Darienzo heading home but they were too late.

Christian Pansini lined a one-out single in the third but, once again, Favieri got the next two batters out but the Blue Devils finally scored once in the fourth. Danny Kohler was hit by a pitch, advanced to second on a groundout to second and scored on Victor Coustan's (2-for-3) RBI single to right.

The 24-4 Maroon, however, took a 5-1 lead in the bottom of the fourth.

Fielding just a handful of seniors this year's Cranford High School girls lacrosse team took some lumps but battled to finish its season with a 7-10 overall record and a 3-4 record in the Independence South Division. The good news is that the Lady Cougars will return the full complement of their scoring threats, however, there will be some vacancies on the defensive side.

Morristown Beard when she made 19 saves, 12 of them in spectacular fashion. Rokicki, who finished her season with two assists, 25 ground balls and winning 23 draw controls, made a number of takeaways in that game.

Sophomore attacker Delaney Bertrand also netted 14 goals, while adding four assists. Two freshmen also played an important role on offense. Clare Roussey netted 13 goals and 11 assists and Sylvie Fernandez netted 11 goals and eight assists. Against Union Catholic, Roussey netted four goals and an assist.

Although listed as a defender, junior Erin Trojan scored five goals and contributed a pair of assists. Sophomore midfielder Erin Esposito netted four goals and five assists, and scooped 29 ground balls. Junior midfielder Paige Brogan finished with three goals and three assists. Sophomore Kristina Lynch contributed three assists. Sophomore Cate Walter got into the draw control mix and won 28 of them.

It appears quite obvious that the Cougars will be very strong offensively next year but several new faces will appear on the defensive side.
