Local Boys' Gymnasts Win International Meet

Nine local boys took first place at the International Gymnastics Boys Invitational in East Stroudsburg, Pennsylvania on December 13. The meet featured gymnasts from the United States, Sweden, Germany and Slovakia.

The local 8-9 age group boys, placed several gymnasts in every event. Ten-year-old Mark Boyle of Westfield placed in five out of six events, placing third only in the 10-11 year-old all-around.

Capturing first in the 8-9 year-old all-

around was so close, only the fifth event brokethetic, with Eric Brandman of Westfield winning the second-place spot. "There had never been a closer race in the history of this meet," according to event judges.

In addition to Eric Brandman's second place, the 8-9 year-old boys swept the next four places. Michael Diaz of Westfield placed third, Joe Levine of Maplewood placed fourth, Jeff Hertz, of Cranford placed fifth and Chris Bizub of Linden placed sixth.

Scotch Plains Senior 50+ Basketball Results Told

Senior Basketball at Scotch Plains was off to a strong start, as the Paterson entry and defending champions Scotch Plains remained undefeated in games as of December 19.

Scotch Plains was played to a half-time tie by a hustling Berkeley Heights squad. A 20-point spurt early in the second half was the difference. This run featured steals, fast break baskets by Tom Aguirre and Lenny Braunstein and a quartet of 3's by Bill Clancy.

Bob Wallace continued to score well for North Plainfield, as did Brian Daugherty for Team Law, which was thrashed by Scotch Plains, which had five players in double figures: Clancy, Braunstein, Aguirre, Frank Martinelli and Pete Tierney.

Raider Rally Falls Shy; Lose to Kearny, 40-32

The Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School wrestling team had to overcome some tough breaks and a 19-0 deficit and nearly pulled it off in their season opener against a strong Cardinal team in Kearny on December 19. Kearny High School held on to win 40-32.

The first bout of misfortune occurred at the 103-pound class. Sophomore David Loewinger relaxed in the third period and dropped a 13-9 decision to Rob Digravina.

The Cardinals dominated the next three weight classes, picking up 16 more points and surging to the 19-0 lead.

At 130, junior Tony Melendez of the Raiders was determined to change the momentum of the match. Melendez, in his normal fired up fashion, tore into Cardinal Tony Caratura immediately, and after defeating him in the first period, Melendez showed Caratura the lights :44 into the second period.

The second major misfortune for the Raiders came in the 135-pound class. Having been down, 8-1, Raider Mike Natale battled back to tie his opponent Marlo Blass, 10-10, forcing the bout into overtime. Just as things appeared to be going Natale's way, he was caught off-guard and lost 14-10.

Raiders Mike Grabel and Luke Cerchio recorded back-to-back pins in the 140 and 145-pound classes, respectively. Cerchio used his skills and aggressiveness to subdue Wilson Alequian in 3:43. At that point the team score was 22-18.

Junior Josh Ricca got the Raiders on top, 24-22, when he decked James Franchino in 5:30 in the 152-pound class; however, the Cardinals won by falls at 160 and 171 to regain the lead, 34-24. Senior Raider Co-Captain Eric Viscardi, who would normally compete at 171, was unable to wrestle due to a wrist injury sustained in practice earlier.

The killer came in the 189 class when Raider senior Tony Zardecki was winning 8-4 but relaxed, got caught off-guard and was pinned. That turnaround caused a nine-point swing in the match score.

Afterwards, Frank Thorne won 14-9 at 215 and Jim Feeley pinned his opponent at heavyweight.

Raider Head Coach Dave Bello stated,

"It was a very close and disappointing match. I felt we were in better condition but not nearly as aggressive as Kearny," Bello added. "Tony Melendez and Luke Cerchio looked great. They had very strong performances. They both dominated and pinned their opponents."

As to what could be learned from this defeat, Bello said, "I told the kids that it was a tough loss, but the first of many matches. We will learn from our lack of aggressiveness and move on," Bello continued. "We have a pretty good team. I know we will bounce back."
