The ring bearer was James Maccia, the nephew of the bridegroom.

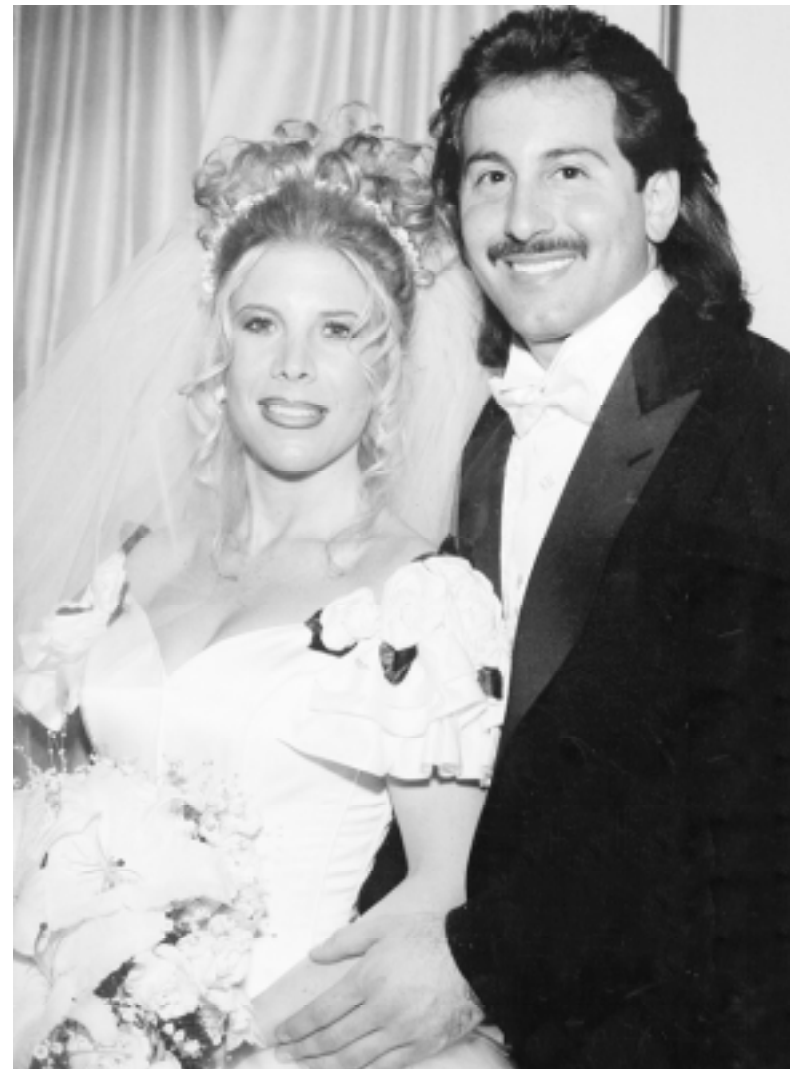
The bride, a 1987 graduate of Westfield High School, is an alumna of Towson State University in Towson, Maryland. She is employed as a first grade teacher.
