Devil Icemen Grab First Win, Then Fall to Hudson Catholic

The Westfield High School ice hockey team captured its first win of the season in round one of the Holiday Tournament at Warinanco Park. The victory over Mendham on December 8 sends Westfield into the semi-finals where they will face off against arch rival Summit.

Senior captain, Ronnie Kashlak, continued his onslaught against opposing goalies by obtaining a hat trick in the game, his second this season.

Kashlak stated, "I've been fortunate to score ten goals so far this season, but it's not like last year because teams are more aware of me.

It's been harder to score. I just try to do my job as best as I can."

Ten minutes into the first period, Kashlak converted on a break away to give Westfield a 1-0 advantage. However, two penalties gave Mendham a five-on-three powerplay. Soon enough, Mendham connected on the opportunity to tie the game.

Near the end of the first period, Westfield picked up another penalty and was forced to play a man down for the rest of the period. On the ensuing power play, Kashlak stole a pass at mid ice, skated in on another break away and scored his second goal of the game.

Westfield and Mendham exchanged goals in the beginning of the second period. Kashlak tallied his third goal on an assist by forward Brandon Kape.

With Westfield clinging to a one goal lead, senior defenseman, Mike Bird, skated behind Mendham's goal, stopped short, watched his defender slide past, then beat the goalie on a wrap-around shot to give Westfield a two goal lead.

Bird boasted, "It was a great game. We all went out there wanting to win. Everyone went out there and gave 110 percent, and it paid off. We really needed this victory."

When the third period came around, Westfield outplayed Mendham and managed to score two more goals allowing only one to the opposition. Converting for Westfield were sophomore forward Dave Strassberg and senior defenseman Kevin Anton. These goals were the first of the season for both Strassberg and Anton.

On December 11, Westfield traveled to Pershing Field in Jersey City to take on state powerhouse, Hudson Catholic. Hudson Catholic dominated from the beginning with a 4-0 lead by the end of the first period.

The second period was similar as Hudson Catholic recorded the next four goals to increase their lead to 8-0. Westfield was able to convert one time before the period was over. Bird connected on a two man advantage for Westfield.

Senior center, Joe Petrucci said, "I don't think that everyone was ready for the game. Our concentration was not there. We played more as individuals and less as a unit. We need to be ready as a whole. We need to practice harder and focus on teamwork. Together with this, changes in

our lines should help us be more successful."

In the third period, Westfield came out strong and was able to tally two more scores as Kashlak converted on both goals, one a power play.

"Although I score, it's been frustrating," said Kashlak. "When a team doesn't win, there's no satisfaction." Unfortunately, Westfield could not keep up with Hudson Catholic's skilled offense which out shot Westfield 52-14. Hudson Catholic scored three more times to win 11-3.

Junior defenseman, Matt O'Neill said, "We came out in the third period loosing, but we came out together as a team. We lost as a team and that is very important."

Blue Devil Bowlers Finish Fourth at Summit Tourney

The Westfield High School bowling team traveled to Madison Plaza Lanes where they competed in the annual Summit Tournament on December 12. The tournament included some of the best teams in the state as well as one team from Pennsylvania.

In the first of six games, Westfield shot a total of 960 among its top five bowlers. Contributing to the score were senior tri-captains, Evan Baum and Brett Rosenblatt, with scores of 202 and 211, respectively. With 960, Westfield found itself in sixth place. The Blue Devils would have to shoot their best to place in the top three positions and advance to the finals.

Game two saw an improvement of 32 pins. Baum led the game with a 224 score. Senior tri-captain, Tim Caprario, followed with a 217 and Rosenblatt, with a 202. Westfield jumped into fifth place and now approached the third of six games.

Senior, Jeff Diamond, said, "I was excited that we got off to such a strong beginning. I knew that if we could keep up that pace, we would remain in contention for the top spots for the rest of the day."

The third game greatly hurt Westfield's chances of reaching the

top three. Although Caprario and Diamond managed scores over 200, Westfield still shot its lowest score of the day, 862 pins. Caprario finished the first series with a 601.

During the break, Westfield was in eighth place and knew it would be a tough uphill battle to reach the third spot.

According to Rosenblatt, "The third game hurt us. It was still a possibility to reach the finals, and we bowled well but not well enough."

After intermission, Westfield came out with great enthusiasm. Game four marked a sensational game by Baum who scored a 299, the fifth of his career. Rosenblatt added a 227, and Westfield totaled a 1043 pin total. In the next game, Westfield managed to keep up this amazing pace. Rosenblatt led the team with a 252. Junior Dan Rock shot 218, Baum added 215, and Caprario totaled 199. The total of 1044 nearly matched that of game three.

Baum remarked, "It was exciting to do so well on an individual basis while we continued to move up in the standings as a team."

Westfield climbed to fifth place with one game remaining. Rosenblatt, Baum and Rock helped carry the team with scores of 232, 225 and 214, respectively. Westfield totaled another outstanding score of 1035.

Unfortunately, Westfield's comeback fell 86 pins short of third place.

Caprario said, "We set a school record of 3122 pins for three games. Everyone shot well over their averages. We bowled terrific, but the four teams that beat us were just a little bit better."

Overall the team averaged 990 pins a game, which is 198 a bowler. Half of the games the team bowled were over 200.

After the six games, Baum led the team with a 221 average and a school record of a 739 pin series for his last three games. Rosenblatt followed with a 212 average and a 711 pin series in his last three games as well. Rounding out the averages were Caprario with a 192 average, Rock with a 186, and Diamond with a 179.

Coach Michael Tirone spoke optimistically, "It was an outstanding way to start the season. The only thing we need to do is work on our spare bowling. We need to improve, and, if we can, we should have no trouble in continuing our success from the past years."

In the past few years, Westfield has captured the Watchung Conference Title, has placed in the top three in both the Union County and State Sectional Tournament, and has qualified for the New Jersey State Championship.
