

Westfield Americans Take Second in Raritan Tourney

The Westfield Americans 8-year old baseball team was edged by powerful Readington, 8-7, in the championship game of the Raritan Valley Baseball League held on July 31 in Warren.

Westfield quickly broke out on top scoring six runs in the first inning. With one out, Michael Carpetto singled then took second on a wild pitch. Brandon Burgdorf singled sending Carpetto to third. Todd Saunders singled in Carpetto. Michael Forghash drilled an RBI double. Michael Kent knocked an RBI single, then Dean Thompson thumped a two-run double. With two outs, Matthew Reiss doubled in Thompson to cap the score at 6-0.

Saunders pitched brilliantly over the first three innings, allowing one run on just three hits. Readington, with a record of 27-0, began to chip away at the Westfield lead, scoring two runs in the fourth and four more in the fifth to take a 7-6 lead.

Westfield rallied in the top of the sixth to tie score at seven, but Readington promptly scored in the bottom of the sixth to win the championship.

The exciting finish capped a very successful season for the Westfield Americans who posted a 12-7 record overall including a second-place in the Kenilworth Tournament.
