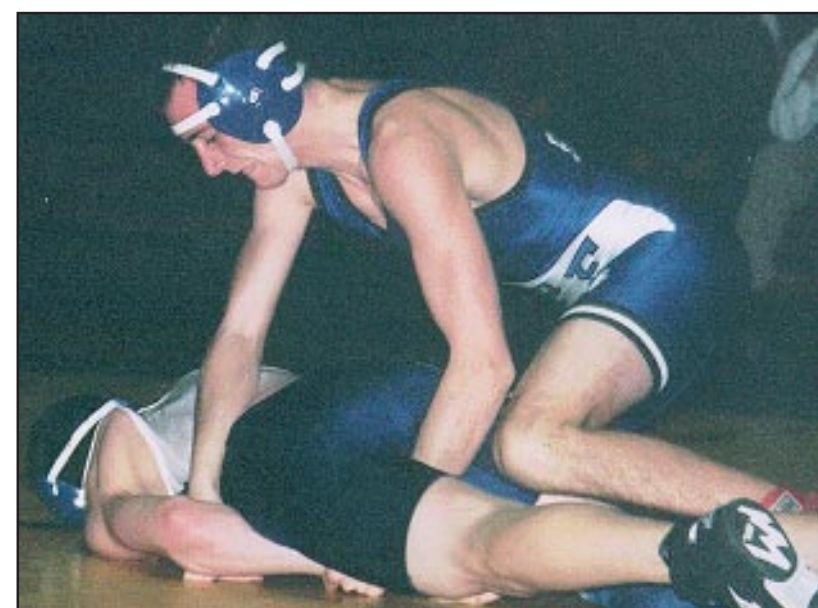

sured, "I wasn't ready and got a little careless in the beginning."

The Cougars won the next five bouts to gain a 24-22 team lead. Cougar Mike Carbone gathered a takedown, a nearfall and a reversal to record a 7-2 decision at 135. Florio Hawkins was awarded four penalty points, an escape, a reversal and a two-point nearfall to pass Mike Natale, 9-4, at 140. Cougar freshman Greg Donofrio edged Mike Grabel, 5-4, at 145, junior John Donofrio received a forfeit, then sophomore Bill Bennett decided a "rock and tumble," 12-11 decision over Marc Ricca at 160.

Bennett initiated the scoring with a spin-behind takedown in the first period, then added three reversals and two, two-point nearfalls in the second while Ricca got two reversals and a nearfall to make the score 12-6. Ricca roared back in the third with a penalty point, a reversal and a two-point nearfall.

"I knew it was going to be an exciting match," said Artigliere of the Bennett/Ricca match. "They are both alike. I know Bill and he is a tricky wrestler. They both do fun things out there."

With respect to the five-straight bouts won by the Cougars, Artigliere commented, "I told them we just had to stay focused and don't worry about the match in front of you or the one behind. Be concerned with your own match."

Raider Josh Ricca broke the Cougars' roar with a punishing disquali-

pleasant task of wrestling undetected, state qualifier Pat Ekstrom at 215. Ekstrom practiced several takedowns before benignly pinning Zommer with a half nelson in 1:11.

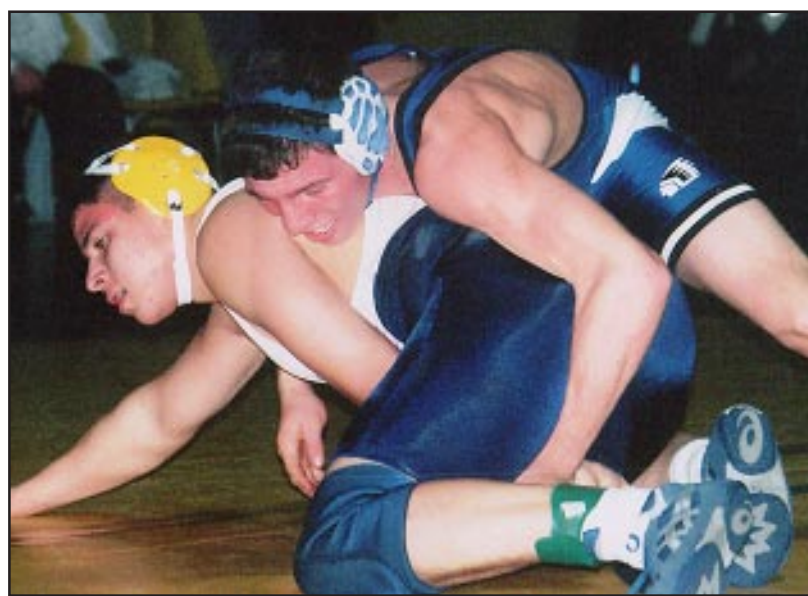
first period.

Blue Devils Seth Burstein and Jay Pollack along with Raider Dave Russ all represented their schools well by placing high in several events at the Pirate Invitational on January 16. The Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School boys placed seventh overall with 93 points and the Westfield boys came in ninth with 82 points.

Burstein finished second in the

100-yard butterfly at :53.73. Nick Kozyra of St. Joseph's won the event with a tie of :52.2. Burstein also finished sixth in the 200-yard individual medley at 2:09.82.

Pollack touched second behind James Lawler of Greenwich in the 200-yard freestyle at 1:50.36. Pollack also placed fourth in the 500-yard freestyle with a tie of 5:06.34.

Russ did quite well in four events and picked up a second in the 100-yard freestyle with a time of :49.37 just behind Craig Dolan of St. Joseph's who touched first at :48.8.
