In July 1999, construction will begin on nine new classrooms at Franklin School. As the largest elementary school in Westfield, Franklin enrolls more than 450 students. The additional classrooms, which were funded through the public bond referendum in December 1998, will alleviate overcrowding and maintain reasonable class sizes. As a result of the bond passage, Franklin will have its classrooms and library cabled for Internet use in the fall of 1999.

Wilson School will feature a new library in the year 2000, with construction beginning July 1999. Second floor lavatory renovation will also begin in July as well as replacement of the flat roof. The funding for these capital projects, as well as cabling of the classrooms and library, comes from the public bond, approved by voters in December 1998. Wilson is Westfield's second largest elementary school, with an enrollment of 478 students.

Six new classrooms will be added to McKinley School as a result of the bond referendum passed by Westfield voters in December 1998. Construction will begin in July 1999 with classrooms ready for students in September 2000. Other bond-approved projects include replacement of the library roof, heating/ventilation/air conditioning upgrade and the cabling of classrooms and the library. Although McKinley is Westfield's oldest school, one of the newest home developments in town has added more families to its enrollment.

The Elm Street building served in many capacities prior to housing the Board of Education/School Administration Offices. The cornerstone was laid in 1914, and the building opened as a four-year high school in 1916. It later became a three-year high school and continued as the town's high school until the present one was built in 1952 on Dorian Road. It was also used as an overflow school during the construction of Roosevelt, Washington, Jefferson and Tamaques Schools. It served as the Franklin School annex until 1976 when it became the administration building.
