Blue Devils, Raiders Fare Well at Summit Relays

The Westfield High School boys captured one first place and the girls placed seven of their teams in the top-six at the Summit Relays held at Tatlock field in Summit on Saturday, April 14. The Scotch Plains-Fanwood boys finished in the top-six in nine of the events and the Raider girls finished in the top-six in three events.

In a very competitive race in the Large School Division, the Blue Devil foursome of Richard Miller, Laquan McCoy, Diano Reavis and Adam Walker proved to be a Union County force by winning the 4x400 relay with a time of 3:28.6. Westfield also placed fourth in the distance medley at 11:32.6, the intermediate hurdles at 3:08.5, the 4x100 at :45.3 and the 4x200 at 1:33.

The Blue Devil girls crossed second in the shuttle hurdles with a time of 1:12.1 and placed third in the 4x800 at 10:25 and the long jump with a distance of 28'11.5". Westfield took fourth in the distance medley relay with a time of 13:56.9 and

placed sixth in the 4x100 at :55.5, the intermediate hurdles at 4:04.9 and the discus with a distance of 161'5".

The Raider boys were very impressive with five second places, and may have had another if it weren't for a disqualification in the 4x400. The most impressive came in the high jump where Rahway and the Raiders both totaled 12'2" - tying a meet record - but Rahway had less misses.

The Raiders also took second in the long jump at 39'8", the shot put with a distance of 121'9.25", the discus with a total of 246'9" and the distance medley with a time of 10:49.7. SP-F also took fourth in the shuttle hurdles at 1:19.3, fifth in the intermediate hurdles at 3:12.8 and sixth in the javelin with a distance of 353'7". An SP-F B team came in fifth in the distance medley relay at 11:34.1.

The Raider girls placed second in the discus with a distance of 183'2", fourth in the intermediate hurdles at 3:46.7 and fifth in the sprint medley at 4:48.3.
