The Westfield Planning Board will meet on April 4, 2005 in Council Chambers in the Westfield Municipal Building, 425 East Broad Street, Westfield, New Jersey at 8:00 p.m. to hear and consider the following application:

05-07(V) WASHINGTON MUTUAL BANK, 184 ELM STREET, BLOCK 2405, LOT 30 SEEKING PRELIMINARY AND MAJOR SITE PLAN APPROVAL. Applicant seeks to occupy a portion of the building for a bank use (a permitted use in the zone) that was previously occupied by Video/Video a retail business. The change in use causes a parking variance that requires the applicant to make application to the Planning Board for site plan approval. Applicant seeks variances from the following:

List of New C.40:55D-70c. Variances Requested
Section 17.02 of the Land Use Ordinance requires 22 off-street parking spaces - 21 spaces are proposed.
Section 17.03C.5 of the Land Use Ordinance requires a minimum setback of 2 feet for parking areas in non-residential zones that but other non-residential uses and zones - ± .5 feet is proposed.
Section 16.04E.1 of the Land Use Ordinance permits only one sign located at the main public entrance - applicant proposes one sign at the main public entrance and an additional sign on the side of the building.

Variances, waivers or exceptions from certain site plan details or relief from requirements may be sought as appropriate.

Spring Break Golf Camp: This hands-on camp is for ages eight to 14 and will be held at the Oak Ridge Golf Course in Clark with teaching pro Bill McCluney. This course will be given Monday through Wednesday, April 4 to 6. Course times are 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. or noon to 3 p.m. The fee is \$99 per child.

Hockey Clinics: Students will learn basic skills or fine-tune their skills with George Giresi and the Westfield High School Ice Hockey Team.
