

Pastor, Vicar to be Honored By Boy Scouts of America

As a result of 25 years of continued service to his community, the Boy Scouts of America approved the rank and dignity of Distinguished Eagle Scout for Father Hummel. He was nominated by the Patriots' Path Council, Boy Scouts of America.

The Distinguished Eagle Scout Award is the only distinguished service recognition that depends on one's

association with scouting as a youth.

Father Hummel received his Eagle Scout Award in 1965 in Troop No. 6 in Caldwell. He is currently the Associate Pastor/Parochial Vicar at Saint Helen's Roman Catholic Church in Westfield.

Father Hummel is the first Catholic parish priest earning the Distinguished Eagle Scout Award. He is Police Chaplain in Westfield, where he is a certified instructor for police training commission.

He is a member of the International Conference of Police Chaplains; Union County Coalition for Substance Abuse; teacher at Saint Helen's Christian Foundation for Ministry Program and Eagle Chairman of the New Jersey Chapter of the Sons of American Revolution Society.
