Dana Lynn Harrison, Beloved Daughter, Sister, Aunt and Friend

Dana Harrison, a 1977 graduate of Westfield High School, died peacefully on March 9 at her home in Berkeley, CA, surrounded by family and friends. She was 57 years old. The cause was a rare and quick-moving cancer.

Dana, gifted with a precocious and rigorous intellect, after graduating from Princeton University moved to the Bay Area in 1981, where she initially pursued a corporate career at Bank of America, then Charles Schwab. Her talent for business and finance earned her numerous professional accolades and promotions including her promotion to Vice President at Schwab, where she was the lead project manager for the mid-1990s build and launch of e.Schwab.

After getting struck by a car in 1997, Dana left the corporate world in 1998 and used her management skills to advance non-profit organizations providing services in the fields of art, theater and dance as well as health. Dana's management skills included not only her financial insights, but also her ability to manage people in a way that empowered them to excel, work effectively together and embrace the changes she advocated.

Dana became a senior executive at Burning Man and made management changes to allow the organization to become financially viable. In 2008 Dana formed her own production company to mount "How to Survive the Apocalypse," a Burning Man-centered rock opera that brought together her love of Black Rock City's eccentric, freewheeling creativity with her passion for opera and theater.

Dana spent two months on the Burmese border setting up management and reporting systems for the group's innovative "Backpack Medics" program, and later prepared grant proposals that have made it financially viable enough to create clinics throughout Thailand. Next, Dana became managing director of Theater Bay Area, the service organization that supports more than

350 performing arts companies in nine counties. Executive Director Brad Erickson called her four-year tenure "transformational. She revamped and revised our financial structures and processes." Dana's impact extended beyond operations. "She was fervent that we needed to be serving audiences as well as theater makers," Erickson said.

The new strategic direction resonated with the theater community, he said. "Theater-makers understood that there was this bigger mission." As the organization's community liaison, Dana spearheaded a volunteer group looking at gender inequities across theater. "They were watching how many female playwrights were being produced, something that local theaters simply hadn't done before," Erickson recalls. Within just a few years, even theaters long married to traditional male-dominated canons were producing seasons equally split between male and female playwrights, he said.

The group's gender tracking extended across casting, directing, and design, creating awareness that gave rise to progress. "Most recently, she became associate director, then executive director of the Ridhwan Foundation, a Berkeley-based spiritual education institute that she studied with for several years and held in high regard. Dana's life choices and rich personal relationships, together with her study of Ridhwan's Diamond Approach teachings, helped bring her great clarity and peace when faced with a sudden terminal diagnosis.

She also lived an audacious life. She embraced extensive travel and vigorous outdoor activity including skiing, trekking and mountain climbing. Dana climbed to 19,000 feet in the Himalayas. Her home hospice turned into a loving, reverent, and often raucous celebration of her life and more than 3,000 people placed entries on the Caring Bridge website expressing their love and thanks to Dana for what she had given to them. The family and friends who surrounded Dana in her final days agreed she had taught us all how to live and how to die.

Dana is survived by her mother, Roslyn Harrison of Westfield, her sister, Julia Matheson, and family in Chevy Chase, MD, and her brother, Michael Harrison, and family in Oakland, CA. Dana was laid to rest in the Fernwood Cemetery in Mill Valley, CA.

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Tours to Be Held April 15 At Historic Hetfield House

MOUNTAINSIDE — The Mountainside Restoration Committee has announced that the Deacon Andrew Hetfield House will be open to the public for tours on Sunday, April 15, from 1 to 3 p.m. Visitors will have an opportunity to get acquainted with this historic local landmark, which features a museum displaying Mountainside artifacts.

The Deacon Andrew Hetfield House was originally built in 1760 by Andrew Hetfield and underwent at least two additions during the early and late 19th century. Originally located across Route 22, the Hetfield House was moved at least two times before it was acquired by the Mountainside Historic Preservation Committee in 1984. In 1985, the house was moved a third time by the Mountainside Restoration Committee to its current site on Constitution Plaza near the Mountainside Public Library.

Visitors can arrive at any time between 1 and 3 p.m. on April 15. Tours last from 20 to 30 minutes and will be ongoing. Anyone who has often wondered what was in that "house by the library" will have a chance to find out. Tours are recommended for ages 8 to adult, but all ages are welcome.

Constitution Plaza is the first right off Birch Hill Road, which is off New Providence Road near the Mountainside Volunteer Fire House. The Mountainside Historic Restoration Committee is a committee of volunteers whose purpose is to restore and maintain the Deacon Andrew Hetfield House and the Levi Cory House and to collect and save historic information and items from destruction.
