Tim Alliegro started the Blue Devils' next drive with a nine-yard run. But two more runs gained nothing, and Westfield was forced to punt. Jack Stagaard's 14-yard pass to Walker-Sutton made it 21-0 before some of the Westfield fans had even arrived yet. Stagaard would complete 10 of 13 passes for 267 yards and three touchdowns.

"Tim got stepped on and couldn't put any pressure on his foot," said DeSarno, adding, "Not sure of his availability this week."

Westfield's next possession started with another Shapiro-to-Chambliss pass and a 15-yard P-burg penalty put the ball at the Stateliner 26. Momentum had totally turned ... but three incomplete passes and a sack gave the ball back. And before you could blink, Stagaard hit Walker-Sutton for a 70-yard touchdown on the next play. With 58 seconds left in the third, it was 35-14 - but it had been very close to being 28-21.

Any chance of a WHS comeback ended with 8:04 left in the game when, on a third-and-10, Stagaard scrambled to avoid a sack and found fullback Bobby Coury in the end zone from 49 yards out.

"The players are playing with great effort, so that's not the problem," DeSarno said. "We have minor breakdowns on plays that lead to big plays. The younger guys that are getting opportunities to play are starting to figure it out, which is good. If they play with a little more confidence in their abilities, we will make more positive plays."

NOTES - WHS, which won the last three state North 2 Group 5 sectional titles, is still in the hunt this fall. The 2-4 Devils are currently ranked No. 11 in North Jersey Group 5; the top 16 qualify, and then be split into North 1 and North 2. With Elizabeth (No. 9 in those rankings) and unbeaten Piscataway (No. 2) coming to Kehler Stadium the next two Satur-

in the North Jersey Group 5 rankings - has won all four meetings against Westfield.

Devil's Den WHS Record Book: Football Passing

A couple weeks ago, there was a discussion on the local radio station about who was the Greatest of All-Time among rock guitarists - after Jimi Hendrix, who the disc jockey anointed as the G.O.A.T.

To be sure, Hendrix was a blazing comet in the late 1960s skies, and was very good. But there are many others who belong in the discussion, including (in alphabetical order): Duane Allman, Chuck Berry, Dickey Betts, Lyndsay Buckingham, Ry Cooder, Dick Dale, Bo Diddley, Robert Fripp, David Gilmour, George Harrison, Brian Jones, Mark Knopfler, Alvin Lee, Alex Lifeson, Brian May, Scotty Moore, Prince, Carlos Santana, Al Stewart, Richard Thompson, Pete Townshend, Eddie Van Halen, Link Wray, Angus Young and many others.

Similarly, how can you compare the great quarterbacks that have played at WHS? From Slingin' Sammy Mitchell in the late 1940s, to Broad Street Joe Monninger two decades later, to future NFLer Dave Brown in the late '80s, to the current crop of record-breakers that coach Jim DeSarno unveils every fall, starting with Tony Dilorio a decade ago and continuing through current standout Hank Shapiro, trying to pick a G.O.A.T. is impossible. So we won't even try.

But here are the numbers WHS quarterbacks have compiled over the years, not including the current 2018 season.

ing two-sport athlete at WHS, died in a truck accident on Oct. 13 on Route 18 in Colts Neck. He was 37 years old.

"Mo" was the leading scorer on the 1998 and 1999 basketball teams, finishing with 586 career points. That ties him for 33rd all-time with Bob Haines ('59), ahead of Hall of Famers Jim Kane, Brian Ciemiecki and Dickie Myers. Boatwright's best game was a 38-point effort against Plainfield, and only Hall of Famer Bob King (43 and 42, both in 1963) ever scored more in one game. He later played collegiately at Montclair State and St. Paul's in Lawrenceville, Virginia.

In addition, Boatwright was a solid backup split end on the 1998 football team that went 9-3 and played Morristown at Giants Stadium for the state sectional title. He caught six passes for 78 yards that season, including four touchdowns, tying tight end Gabe Perez for the team high.

For the first time in the 38-year history of the Union County Girls Soccer Tournament, WHS was one-and-done after falling to Summit, 1-0, in Saturday's quarterfinals. The Lady Devils won 20 UCT titles and were runner-up another five times. The boys, meanwhile, needed double overtime before eliminating Cranford, 3-2. The Blue Devils, who won the UCT in 2016 and tied Elizabeth last fall, will face archrival Scotch Plains in the semifinals next Saturday.

1947: With Joe Freeman in Rhode Island for his mother's funeral, Bart Ellis coached WHS to a 4-7 win at Roselle Park. Sam Mitchell ran for one TD and passed to Charlie Schrope for two more.

1969: Brad Brewster's 88-yard run from scrimmage sparked WHS to a 23-14 victory over Scotch Plains.

AROUND THIS DATE

Oct. 17, 1936: Americo 'Pump' Vella scored five touchdowns in a 44-0 rout of Madison.

Oct. 17, 1964: Before 5,000 fans in a driving rain storm at Recreation Field, WHS overcame a 172-yard effort by Terry Morton to beat Scotch Plains, 16-6.

Oct. 17, 2008: Tony Dilorio completed 11 passes for 192 yards and three touchdowns as WHS defeated Union, 24-20.

Oct. 19, 1946: Bob Dougherty scored three touchdowns in a 21-0 win over Roselle Park.

Oct. 19, 1974: Before a crowd of over 9,000 fans, Glen Kehler returned from a dislocated wrist injury to run for 178 yards in a 17-6 win over Scotch Plains.

Oct. 19, 1990: In a game played under portable lights at Recreation Field, WHS fell to Union, 12-0. The Devils came into the game 4-0 and ranked (No. 18) in the state for the first time in eight years.

Oct. 19, 1991: Steve Kocaj caught a 58-yard touchdown pass from Chris Infantino with 12 seconds left on the clock as WHS stunned Scotch Plains, 6-0.
