Raider Swim Girls Win UCT Crown; WF Girls, Boys 2nd





Boys swimming: Despite getting eight Top-15 all-time performances, the Blue Devils' seven-year reign as Union County champions ended in a wild three-way contest between Summit (405 points), WHS (400), and Scotch Plains (378).

The Devils' medley relay (Roan Baker, Tom Brennan, Zach Youssef, Cooper Prieto) went 1:36.62, the sixth fastest in school history, but lost by .03 of a second to Summit. Baker had WHS's fifth fastest 200 IM (1:57.55) and ninth best 100 back (53.96), finishing second in both. Prieto's 21.89 was good for No. 2 in the county, and No. 13 all-time at WHS. Matt Swenson's 4:53.82 was the 14th fastest in school history, and fourth in the county. The 200 free relay (Jeremy Kronheimer, Baker, Youssef, Prieto) was second, and No. 10 all-time, while Brennan was WHS's only county champion, with a 59.13 that makes him the No. 8 all-time and the 10th sub-minute breaststroker in school history. Barney Veres was third in the event, and No. 12 all-time.

Girls swimming: The WHS girls came close, but Scotch Plains ran its county win streak to five in a row with a 10-point victory (385-375). The Devils won three events (medley relay, 200 IM and 400 free relay) had nine Top 15 all-time performances.

The medley relay (Keeley Thompson, Elllie Cestero, Abby McKinney, Viv Jeckell) swam the eighth-fastest time in school history. The 4x100 free relay (Julia McGann, Viv Jeckell, Marcelina Krowinskda, McKinney) went 3:37.85, No. 13 all-time. McKinney's 2:11.23 won the IM and is No. 5 all-time, while her butterfly (58.59) was fourth place, and No. 3

McGann's 1:57.49 was good for third place, and No. 8 all-time. McKinney Viv Jeckell's 25.13 in the 50 was fifth overall, and No. 15 alltime. Natalie Lee's 59.99 was fifth overall, and No. 10 all-time. Thompson was runner-up in the 100 back, but her 1.11 was No. 6 all-time. And Jenna Daniel finished sixth in the 100 breast, which is No. 12 all-time.

New Providence last week was the 19th shutout in program history, and also the largest winning margin. The first whitewash was over Dayton in 1967, and Gary Kehler's team added 12 more. Don MacDonald's teams had three shutouts, all over Plainfield. This was the third for Glen Kurz, and the first since 2012 against Glen Ridge. The Blue Devils rolled to a 51-18

win over five-time reigning county champion Cranford in Friday night's battle of unbeaten UCC teams. It was the teams' 61st meeting, since December 1958 when WHS kicked off the Gary Kehler era with a 22-19 victory. The Devils have won the last two years and lead the series 40-20-1. Cranford won 64-9 in 2016.

About 12 hours later the Kurzmen were up in Blairstown for a quad meet, losing their first matches of the season-46-18 to eighth-ranked North Hunterdon and 35-31 to Newton.

WHS appears to have locked up the No. 2 seed for the sectional tournament that begins Monday. They will likely host Piscataway on Feb. 6 and, if they win that, visit top-seeded Watchung Hills on Feb. 8.

Girls basketball: Freshman Grace Klag had a personal-best 20 rebounds against Elizabeth, the third highest one-game total in school history. The school record (25) was by Shi-Kia Carter in 1994. Klag and Sam Stravach had 12 points each as WHS (11-5) rolled over Cranford, 43-34, Satur-
