



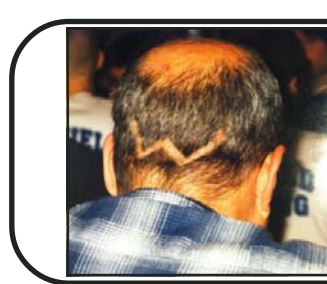

WHS Boys Varsity Volleyball Team Is Making Its Mark

On a spring afternoon at Westfield High School, the gymnasium echoes with the whack of volleyballs slamming into the floor as boys leap into the air, hitting the balls full force. In 2017, after years of lobbying by students Alex Cisneros and Cory Billings, the WHS Athletic Director, Sandra Mamary established a boys volleyball club team. The idea was to gauge interest and determine whether a varsity and junior varsity program might someday become viable. The results were surprising. Over two dozen boys showed up at the interest meeting, and the club team came into being. That season, parents and players demonstrated their enthusiasm and support, and the following school year the Board of Education approved boys volleyball as a varsity sport. In 2018, as a New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association (NJIAA) varsity team, the Westfield High School boys, coached by Jay Cook, had a very successful inaugural season, reaching the county's semifinals. The Union County Conference

named Blue Devils Cory Billings and David Broughton as First and Second Team players, respectively. This spring, Ed Saggio was named coach for the varsity team. Coach Saggio has been involved with a number of very successful girls' high school teams in New Jersey since 1983, including Columbia, Paramus, and Paramus Catholic High Schools. In their second season, the WHS boys varsity team, led by captains Julian Trott, Broughton and Alfredo Cardenas-Caceres, is wrapping up the season with six wins and seven losses in the league, with one more game scheduled this Friday against Linden High School. Alan Solovey, a junior on the varsity team, has witnessed the team's development. "The team has evolved quite a bit over these last three years both in terms of physical skill and mental connection across the team. Many of us have been together for all three years and have become quite close." Junior Elijah Soh concurs, "The

thing I like the most about being on the team is how everyone encourages each other in every single play. If anyone is down, the team makes sure that everyone has your back." Coach Saggio is pleased with the results, "This year's team had a remarkable year. In only its second season the team was highly competitive in every single match. We look forward to continued growth." The boys credit their coach for their improvement. "Coach Saggio has clearly helped the team improve this year by focusing on key fundamentals," said Soh. Solovey added, "He definitely knows a lot about the game and has helped us improve on playing technically sound volleyball." The future of the varsity team's success is dependent on the development of younger players, beginning with the junior varsity team, coached by Dave Tarullo. "Next year I hope to bring more people into this program and ultimately win more games," Soh said. In addition, AD Mamary plans to establish an 8th grade boys volleyball team in the district next spring. As another training opportunity for younger boys, the WHS girls varsity volleyball coach, Beverly Torok, runs a spring clinic for middle schoolers and a summer camp through the Westfield Recreation Department for elementary grades and middle schoolers. Devil's Den McLane Puts His Name At Top of the Charts

Devon McLane became the all-time leading goal scorer in WHS boys lacrosse history on Saturday. The senior, four-year starting attackman came into the game at New York City's Fordham Prep trailing Ryan Yarusi and Luke Prybylski by one goal (123-122). He scored two goals and added four assists in the 14-2 victory. He was already the career leader in points (280) and assists (156). And McLane is closing in on another school record. With 94 points this season (47 goals, 47 assists), he is just five behind the single-season scoring mark set by the legendary Rob Schmalz in 1986. Devon, the son of former Blue Devil football and lacrosse standout Jason McLane ('89), will be playing his collegiate lacrosse at Brown University in Providence, R.I. The WHS boys lacrosse program was started in 1978 by coach Shaun Cherewich, when the games were played at Sycamore Field, behind the "new" firehouse. The highly successful program has won three state titles (1986, 1987, 2014) and produced 21 all-Americans: Dan Gilday, Rob Schmalz (twice), Steve Locker, Tim Nolan, Gregg Schmalz, Brendan Flaherty (twice), Jason McLane, Chris Wojcik (twice), Ed Joffe, Mike Daly, Chris Zaffuto, Christian Burdorf, Luke Prybylski (twice), Pat Aslanian, Jack Simcox, Owen Prybylski, and Nick Bond.

week for the Union County Tournament title, figure to get a top seed for sectionals, and could have a semifinal date with Bayonne, the only team to beat them. **Boys lacrosse:** When the Blue Devils lost to Summit, 9-4, in the Union County Tournament final, it was the 14th time in the UCT's 17-year history that those two met in the title game. The Hilltoppers hold a 9-5 advantage in finals. WHS won back-to-back in 2006-07, and captured three in a row from 2015-17. The boys began state tournament play yesterday.

After third-place finishes in the recent conference and county meets, Ryan Daly's squad captured the state North 1-2 Group 4 sectional at Hawk Pointe Golf Club in Washington. Baseball: The Brew Crew will qualify for this year's state tournament as a No. 7 or 8 or 9 seed in North 2, Group 4. The team was 6-11 record after being no-hit Saturday by Hunterdon Central in a rematch of last year's state Group 4 title game. It was only the third time the Devils have been no-hit during coach Bob Brewster's 37 years at the helm, most recently by Cranford's Kevin Feeley in the 1998 Union County Tournament. **Softball:** Caitlin Cheddar's girls, who played Roselle Park earlier in the

Girls lacrosse: The fifth-seeded WHS girls, who lost to UCT champion Summit on Saturday, face familiar foe Hillsborough in their state tournament quarterfinal match-up. The Devils went on the road last year and upset the Raiders en route to the first state sectional title in school history. **Tennis:** WHS has had 10 matches end in a 3-2 score this spring and they've won eight of them. None was closer than the May 8 win over Christian Brothers Academy. It was reminiscent of the 3-2 win over West Windsor-Plainsboro South in the 2007 Tournament of Champions final. WHS's two losses against CBA were both three-setters, as was one of its victories. The other two were "only" two-setters, but the scores were 7-6, 7-6 in one and 7-6 and 7-5 in the other. That's why first and second dubs are every bit as important as singles matches in dual meets. The second-seeded Devils started state tournament play earlier this week and, if the seeds hold up, they'll visit top-seeded Ridge on Monday in the sectional final. **Track:** The boys and girls will be at Plainfield's Hub Stine Field this afternoon for the Union County Championships, which have been held for around 100 years. The WHS boys have won the team title 11 times – 1924, 1925, 1926, 1940, 1973, 1979, 1982, 1986, 1987, 2008 and 2010; the girls have never finished higher than second, which they've done eight times – 1992, 1994, 1997, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2017 and 2018. **THE 'OTHER' HALL OF FAME**
The Westfield Hall of Fame, another local project that evolved under the helm of the late Lee Hale, with assistance from the Westfield Historical Society, will hold its sixth induction dinner this September, with 12 new inductees. Among them are a few familiar names that could be familiar to local sports fans. Bob Brewster Sr., who is already in the Newark Athletic Hall of Fame and the Westfield Athletic Hall

has a street named after him, was a two-time all-American end at Rutgers and also was class valedictorian in 1919. He was a (Harlem) Renaissance man, playing professional football, and later becoming both a movie and stage star, a well-known singer and an early and very important civil rights activist. Cassidy is the mother of WHS athletes Tom and Lynne Cassidy. Tom played basketball and baseball; Lynne was a fantastic swimmer and was inducted into the WAHOF in 2014 as both a member of the 1987-88-89 girls swim teams and as an individual. The WHOF has inducted 71 people since 2008, among the sport-related ones are Gary Kehler, Jeff Torborg, Bob Clotworthy, the McGinley family, Grover Connell, Charles Coddling and Hale. The last induction was in 2016. Previous inductions were in 2009, 2010, 2011 and 2012. **PICKLEBALL CONTENDER**
Tom Quimby ('65) recently finished second and fourth in the U.S. Open Pickleball Championships in Naples, Fla. Pickleball is a paddle sport that combines elements of badminton, tennis and ping pong. Quimby and Glenn Marten of Harborsburg, Pa., played in the 70-plus event and lost a close battle in the bronze medal match. In the 70-plus 4.5 event they reached the gold-medal match but had to settle for second place. Quimby, who currently lives in Wellfleet, Mass., and Sebastian, Fla., was quick to jump on the bandwagon for what has become the fastest growing sport in the country. "I played racquetball for 50 years," Quimby said, "so I had a pretty sound foundation to get pretty good quickly." Quimby, who will turn 72 in August, is a certified Pickleball instructor, in Vero Beach, Fla., during the winter months and on Cape Cod in the summer.
