Riding high on a wave of a late rally and the defense to make a lead stand, the Red Thunder soundly defeated Mitch Aronson's Club 40, 21-16, in JCC Softball League action on August 5 at Tamaques Park in Westfield.

Club 40 kept it a game throughout, trailing just 11-8 after four innings and valiantly struggling against a deficit that simply could not be overcome. Aronson led early run-production by example and finished 4-for-5 with two RBI. Gary Shaeffer clubbed four hits and had an RBI. Mike Schuman went 3-for-5 with a homer, Jay Tepper went 4-for-5 with three RBI and Adam Kaplan went 2-for-5 with a homer and two RBI. The offense was there. It just wasn't as loud as Thunder.

Despite squandering an initial commanding lead of five runs in the first inning, the Red Thunder erupted

for nine runs in the bottom of the sixth, and made the lead stick in the top of the seventh with rally-zapping defense. Leadoff man Lowell Weiner capped off that rally by smashing a grand slam that vaulted the Thunder into a comfortable lead. Brian Saftlas did that inning what he did all game - he got hits. He went 5-for-5 with an RBI. Gerry Powers, who finished with three hits and three RBI, kept the rally going with a solid base hit. Jon Applebaum walloped a homer, putting his stats for the day at an impressive 4-for-5 with two homers and two RBI. His homer came right on the heels of the first one of the inning, hit by Gary Wasserman.

Wasserman, who finished with seven RBI, dominated. That sixth-inning home run was his third of the day in five plate appearances. When asked why he looked tired after the sixth-inning, he took a long chug of water and smiled. "Too much running," he said.

Two brilliant plays from Thunder third baseman Dan Aarons in the seventh drained the possibility of a huge Club 40 comeback. Two hard liners screamed to the hot corner, one from Kaplan and the final one from Aronson's bat. Aarons snagged them on reflex for two clutch putouts, Aronson's liner being the third.

Aronson himself was optimistic about the outcome. "We only had nine guys. I'm proud of how we played hard, and took 'em to the end," he said with a shrug.

Thunder Captain Lou Safirin expected the result to be indicative of future success. "We're marching to first place. Watch out, CBI 2," he stated with a smile.
