Westfield's 12-year-old travel baseball team won their championship game, 8-6, over Bedminster at Longhill on July 24. Thanks to an overall team contribution both defensively and offensively, Dickson's Dozen played baseball the way it was designed, with aggressive hitting, fearless fielding and tenacious pitching.

In the top of the first, Pete Cornell walked, Danny Dickson executed a perfect bunt single and Adam Becker rapped an RBI single. Zachary Deegan stepped up and drilled a two-run double to give Westfield a 3-0 lead. In the bottom of the first, Deegan retired the side with only four pitches.

Westfield added a run in the second due to a collision on a pop up involving the shortstop and second baseman. The bottom of the inning was over in a blink thanks to great defensive plays from third baseman Brian Davidson and shortstop A. J. Rimondi.

In the third, Kevin O'Rourke, who went 3-for-3 with a walk, poked an RBI single to left to increase the lead to 5-0. Unfortunately, Bedminster immediately erupted to tie the score. Bedminster threatened in the fourth, but Becker, playing first, grabbed a hard line drive and Westfield held them scoreless.

Westfield seized an 8-5 lead in the sixth when Harrison Mercado hammered a three-run homer over the left field wall. Bedminster added a solo homer to finalize the scoring. Mike Freundlich, playing short, made two sweet stops to help finish Bedminster.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF WESTFIELD CHAPTER 13, "MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC"; ARTICLE III, "STOPPING, STANDING AND PARKING", DIVISION 2, "LIMITED TIME PARKING ZONES-STREETS", SEC. 13-26, "TWO HOUR ZONES-UNMETERED"

BEIT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Westfield of the County of Union, as follows:

SECTION 1: That the Code of the Town of Westfield be and is hereby amended by revising Section 13-26 "Two Hour Zones-Unmetered" in Chapter 13, "Motor Vehicles And Traffic", Article III, "Stopping, Standing And Parking", Division 2 "Limited Time Parking Zones-Streets", by adding a section, placed in the appropriate order of streets, alphabetized by first letter so that the same shall read as follows:

- Westfield Ave. (1) Both sides between South Avenue and First Street and its extension. (2) Both sides between Dorian Road / Park St. and Washington St. between the hours of 8:00 am and 2:00 pm Monday through Friday.

SECTION II. Any or all ordinances or parts thereof in conflict, or inconsistent, with any part of the terms of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are in such conflict or inconsistent.

SECTION III. In the event that any section, part of provision of this ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court, such holdings shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part so held unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION IV. This ordinance shall take effect after passage and publication as soon as, and in the manner, provided by law.

- Fairfield Circle (1) Both sides for the entire length between the hours of 8:00 am and 2:00 pm Monday through Friday.

SECTION II. Any or all ordinances or parts thereof in conflict, or inconsistent, with any part of the terms of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are in such conflict or inconsistent.

SECTION III. In the event that any section, part of provision of this ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court, such holdings shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part so held unconstitutional or invalid.
