Four Blue Devil Laxers Gain All-State Recognition

The Westfield High School Lacrosse Team was well-represented at the annual awards dinner of the New Jersey Interscholastic Lacrosse Coaches Association held at Rutgers University on Thursday, June 14. Additionally, in a separate selection, Blue Devil Head Coach Gerry Benaquista was named Boys Lacrosse Coach of the Year by the *Courier News*.

First Team All-State honors went to Westfield Co-Captain Bradley

Gillin. Gillin was a versatile middle who led the sixth-ranked Westfield squad in scoring until he was sidelined by a season-ending ankle injury late in the year. Gillin, who also was selected First Team All-Area by the *Courier News*, will be attending Lehigh University in the fall.

Co-Captain Jim Mitchel and attackman Chris Dodge were both named to the All-State Second Team and both were named to the *Courier News* First Team All-Area. Mitchel led the Blue Devils in ground balls as one of the premier defensemen in the state. He will attend Stevens Institute of Technology. Dodge was a prodigious scorer who ended his career as the second highest scorer in school history. He will attend Washington College.

Evan Molloy, who was named Second Team All-Area along with junior Mike Debossy, received All-State Honorable Mention. A tenacious defender, Molloy was known for his aggressive stick-checking. He will attend Penn State University. Senior Matt Simone and sophomore Billy Schultz received All-Area Honorable Mention recognition.

This season, Co-Captains Bramnick and Rogers led the Blue Devils to an undefeated regular-season record and a Watchung Conference title.

Rogers was also selected First Team All-Group 4 and Bramnick was named to the Second Team. For girls golf, junior Erin Cockren made All-State Second Team. Mike and Jason Occi of Cranford, J. P. Longueil of Oratory Prep, Marc Henkel of Roselle Park and Tim Azoia of A. L. Johnson were also selected to the First Team All-Union County. Longueil, who also won the Meet of Champions, was named Player of the Year.

Westfield was seeded 12th going into the state tournament, but lost in the second round to Ridgewood after defeating St. Joseph, 11-3, in the first round.

One stabilizing factor for the Blue Devils all season was their ferocious defense.

"I thought it was a solid season despite injuries, and we were able to play very well throughout the season, until it caught up with us in the state finals. It was an uphill battle all season and we eventually caved in and got dominated by team we shouldn't have," said junior defenseman Dillon DePalmer.

Looking ahead to next season, Westfield will be returning many of their current starters. Next year's captains will be DePalmer, Santoriello, Riley and Mike Debossy. The junior varsity (JV) boys finished undefeated at 16-0 and promise a very bright outlook. JV standouts such as sophomore attackman Gil Arbitsman and midfielder Dan Kane as well as defenseman Dan McDonald, Dan Seeger, and Chris Freisen, should rejuvenate the Blue Devils and prep them for another run at the states.

"We're hoping to end in the top three in the state," expressed DePalmer.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND GENERAL ORDINANCE 1762 FIXING THE ANNUAL SALARIES FOR THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL MEMBERS AND CERTAIN OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE TOWN OF WESTFIELD

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Westfield in the County of Union as follows:

SECTION I.
