pears to be a shining star for the future but did some glowing this season. She rolled in 150 points, including 47-66 free throws and led the team in rebounds with 104 - 64 defensive and 40 offensive - and in blocked shots with 28. 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He also was 79 percent from the free throw line. Donnell Clark scored 54 points as well as dishing out 31 assists (tied for third on the team). Adam Turner finished his second campaign as a varsity player with 76 points and 30 rebounds. Chris Friesen contributed greatly beyond the arc, launching nine three-pointers (fourth on the team).

This season's top Blue Devil team effort came against Linden late in the season as they handed the Tigers a

67-59 defeat. It was the first time in over 15 years the Blue Devil had achieved that feat. This feat was even more special, considering Linden's triumph over St. Patrick's in the Union County Tournament finals.

A positive stat for the Blue Devils was their free throw shooting as they shot 64 percent from the line while reaching the foul line 307 times. Looking to next year, Clark said, "The team should be very strong because almost everyone is coming back and most of the team plays basketball year round."

Devil Swim Boys Met the Best; The Future Looks Very Bright

When was the last time the Westfield High School (WHS) boys swim team lost six meets in a season? In the last 47 years, it has only happened twice. The 1983 team was 10-6 and the 1954 team was 5-6.

But appearances can be deceiving. This year's WHS boys' team went 10-6, but the six losses were to teams ranked No. 1 (Cherry Hill East), 2 (Holy Spirit), 4 (St. Joseph), 5 (CBA), 7 (Bridgewater-Raritan) and 8 (Shawnee) in the state. And most of them were close enough to be considered winnable.

The final loss came on Tuesday, February 27, in the NJSIAA Public A Division finals against Cherry Hill East, which roared to a 101-69 victory at Rider University. The win by the Cougars avenged their loss to the Blue Devils in the 2000 state final.

Westfield had steamrolled into the final with overwhelming wins over Vernon in the North Jersey sectional final and Bridgewater-Raritan in the state semifinals, avenging a season-

opening loss. The Blue Devils posted 40 season-best swims out of a possible 60 in the Bridgewater win.

"(Bridgewater) was our best meet," said WHS co-captain Cliff Haldeman, whose 2:01.68 clocking vs. Cherry Hill was a lifetime best and seventh best on the WHS Top 15 List. "We expected the Cherry Hill meet to be a lot closer. But we really can't be too upset with the times we swam tonight."

Sometimes, the other team is just better.

"When you have two top guys in every event like they do, it's tough to break them up... and it doesn't matter how fast or slow their third guy is," WHS coach Bruce Johnson said. "We had a lot of good swimmers, but they had a lot more of them."

East jumped on top with a 1-3 in the opening medley relay and pretty much never looked back. The Cougars got 1-2 finishes in the 50 free, 100 free and 100 back. Westfield's top performances included co-captain Matt Vidovich's season-best 1:02.19 in the 100 breast (tied for first) and freshman J.J. Sobala, whose 55.81 in the 100 fly was good for 15th spot on the Top 15 List and who later clocked a lifetime best 1:04.56 in the 100 breast.

"We've waited a long time to be state champs," said East coach Bo Wood. "Westfield has been our top competition for years and it's nice to beat a high-quality team like theirs to get back on top."

Against Bridgewater, sophomore Zack Coppa won the 200 (1:49.07) and 100 (50.73) freestyles. The meet was fairly close until the 200 free relay, where WHS went 1-2 behind the teams of Coppa, Ryan Bartholomew, Haldeman, Sean Baran (1:33.82), and Dave Hedman, Greg Matthews, Drew Ruotolo, Devin Power (1:35.97).

Freshman Bartholomew tied for first in the 50 free at 22.94, while classmate Sam Gurdus (season-best 56.72 in the 100 fly) and Josh Schoenfeld (20-second drop to 5:18.92 in the 500) both had big nights. Junior Rob

Freundlich had two season-bests in the 100 fly (56.79) and 100 back (59.59), as did classmate Power in the 200 free (1:54.43) and 100 free (52.61).

Coppa again came up big vs. Vernon, with wins in the 200 and 500 freestyles. Again it was a 10-point meet into the 200 free relay, but another 1-2 by the Blue Devils (Baran, Haldeman, Bartholomew, Coppa on the "A" and Josh Schoenfeld, Matthews, Ruotolo, Power on the "B") put it away.

"We had a really successful season... and the future looks very bright," Johnson said. "Cherry Hill East has the best junior class in the state, but Westfield has the best sophomore and freshman classes in the state. It'll likely be the same teams in the final next year... and the next year Westfield should be unbelievably good, if the guys all stay focused on being state champs."
