"His record is 7-2 and he is playing at the top of his game."

Powerful Spartans Stagger Improving Viking Nine, 22-3

Intimidation may play a big role when a high school baseball team must face the eighth-ranked 13-1 Immaculata Spartans. Indeed, the powerful Spartans are a talented squad and the entire lineup appears to spend a lot of time in the weight room. The Spartans certainly used that talent, power and intimidation when they staggered Union Catholic, 22-3, in Scotch Plains on April 27.

Prior to the game, the Vikings sported a 5-6 record and just came off a heartbreaking, 11-8, loss to Rahway on April 24. Junior Joe Medway, who has been hitting well all season, had three hits against the Indians.

Although the sizable Spartans, in five innings, amassed an 18-hit attack, which included two home runs, four triples and a double, Medway did not back down when he stepped to the plate and singled in all three at bats.

"He is a very disciplined hitter," said Viking Head Coach Rich Planer. "He looks pitches over, takes strikes when he needs to and goes with the ball. He basically hits the ball where it is pitched."

Planner also pointed out the progress of three other Vikings.

"John Losavio is a first year player. He hasn't played for four years. We got the rust off and he has made some tremendous strides. (sophomore) Kevin Gates has excellent speed and I'm expecting some good leadership from (junior) Roger Barrueco."

For a brief period, the Vikings held a 1-0 lead when leadoff batter Kevin Gates walked, advanced to second on a throwing error and scored on Roger Barrueco's single in the bottom of the first.

The Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School boys track team placed second at the Randolph Relays on April 28 in Randolph. The Raiders totaled 66 points in the meet which was won by Hunterdon Central with 79 points. Union came in a close third at 63.5 points.

Aberdeen, Mike Dixon, Mike Franzone and Williams won the 4x400 meters with a time of 3:26.79 and Walter Biner, Zack McGuire, Bob Wallden and Dixon crossed first in the 4x1,600 with a time of 18:51.57.
