ALLENTOWN, Pa.: Senior right fielder Marcus Mattielli of Westfield recently reached a career milestone when he recorded his 100th hit for the Muhlenberg College baseball team.

Mattielli reached the century mark when he drove a single between short and third in the sixth inning of the second game of a doubleheader at Franklin & Marshall on April 21. The Mules went on to win, 3-2, earning a split of the twinbill.
