BE IT OBTAINED by the Town of Westfield in the County of Union as follows: SECTION I. That traffic calming measures, including but not limited to, the following, be installed at various locations along Rahway Avenue, East Broad Street and other locations deemed necessary:

- a. Speed "humps" or "tables" with appropriate signage and pavement markings
b. Raised crosswalks
c. Textured pavement
d. "Bulb-outs" at intersections
e. Modification of pavement width and/or alignment
f. "Strobe" light crosswalks
g. Enhanced signage and pavement markings

SECTION II. That all professional engineering services required in connection with the aforesaid traffic calming measures be provided under this ordinance.
