AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE REBUILDING REPLACEMENT OR EXTENSION OF STORM OR SANITARY SEWER SYSTEMS AND THEIR APPURTENANCES AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS, RESTORATION OF TAMAKUES PARK POND, ENGINEERING STUDY OF GREGORY'S POND, THE HIRING OF CONSULTANTS TO PERFORM NECESSARY STUDIES ON THE STORM AND SANITARY SEWERS, AND PONDS, AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF THE MONIES NECESSARY THEREFOR.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Westfield in the County of Union as follows:

SECTION I. That the following improvements be made to the storm or sanitary sewer systems and their appurtenances to provide for the proper maintenance and operation of those systems:

a. Rebuild, replace or extend sanitary and storm sewer lines and their appurtenances at various locations throughout Town in accordance with specifications and plans prepared by the office of the Town Engineer.

b. Dredging and disposal of sediment from Tamakues Park Pond, installation of bank stabilization measures and any other items incidental to said work.

c. Provide for the hiring of consultants to perform necessary studies and investigations at various locations on the storm sewers, sanitary sewers, and ponds; obtain any permits required and any other services incidental to the work.

SECTION II. That all said work shall be undertaken as a general improvement to be paid for by general taxation.

SECTION III. It is hereby determined and declared that the estimated amount of money to be raised from all sources to said purpose is \$360,000.00 and that the estimated amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$340,000.00. There is hereby appropriated for said purpose the sum of \$20,000.00 from Capital Improvement Funds available for said purpose.

SECTION IV. To finance such improvements there shall be issued pursuant to Local Bond Law and R.S. 40A:2-8 of the State of New Jersey, in anticipation of the issuance of bonds, Bond Anticipation Notes of said Town which shall not exceed in the aggregate principal amount the sum of \$340,000.00. Said notes shall bear interest at a rate as hereafter may be determined within the limitations prescribed by law, and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to, and within, the limitations prescribed by said law.

SECTION V. Not more than \$1,000.00 of the sum to be raised by the issuance of said notes may be used to finance interest on obligation issued to finance such purpose, whether temporary or permanent, and legal expenses, or to finance the cost of the issuance of such obligations as provided in R.S. 40A:2-20.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REPLACEMENT OF CURBING AND CONSTRUCTION OF NEW CURBING ON VARIOUS STREETS AND THE APPROPRIATION OF MONIES NECESSARY THEREFOR.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town of Westfield in the County of Union as follows:

SECTION I. That the following streets be improved in the following manner:

- 1. Maye Street - Entire Length, both sides
2. West Dudley Avenue - Clark Street to Coleman Place, both sides
3. Channing Avenue - Glen Avenue to Poet's Place, both sides
4. Dudley Court - Entire Length, both sides
5. Birch Avenue - Bradford Avenue to Standish Avenue, both sides
6. Knollwood Terrace - Partial

Improvements:

- a. Construct new granite block curb or replace the existing curbing with new granite block curbing, as applicable.
b. Repair sidewalks and driveways damaged as a result of the curbing installation work.
c. All work necessary and incidental thereto.

SECTION II. That all the said improvements shall be made and completed under the supervision of the Town Engineer and in accordance with preliminary plans and specifications which are now on file in the office of the Town Engineer and are hereby made a part of this ordinance.

SECTION III. That one hundred (100%) percent of the final cost of the curb for Channing Avenue and Knollwood Terrace, and fifty percent (50%) of the final cost for the other streets named above, as certified by the Chief Financial Officer shall be assessed by the Tax Assessor on lands specially benefited by the improvement.

SECTION IV. It is hereby determined and declared that the number of annual installations in which the special assessment to be levied on account of the said improvements may be paid is five (5).

SECTION V. It is hereby determined and declared that the estimated amount of monies necessary to be raised from all sources for said purpose is \$190,650.00 and that the estimated amount of Bond Anticipation Notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$180,650.00. There is hereby appropriated to said purpose the sum of \$10,000.00 from Capital Improvement Funds available for said purpose.

SECTION VI. To finance such purpose there shall be issued pursuant to R.S. 40A:2-8 in anticipation of the issuance of bonds, Bond Anticipation Notes of said Town not to exceed in the aggregate principal amount the sum of \$180,650.00. Said notes shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may hereafter be determined within the limitations prescribed by said law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to, and within, the limitations prescribed by said law.

SECTION VII. Not more than \$1,000.00 of the sum to be raised by the issuance of said notes may be used to finance such purpose, whether temporary or permanent, or to finance engineering or inspection costs and legal expenses or to finance the cost of the issuance of such obligations as provided in R.S. 40A:2-20.

SECTION VIII. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose for which said notes are to be issued is a period of ten (10) years from the date of said bond.

SECTION IX. It is hereby determined and declared that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Town Clerk of said Town and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of the Town as defined in R.S. 40A:2-43 of said Revised Statutes is increased by this ordinance by \$180,650.00, and that the notes authorized by this ordinance shall be within any debt limitations prescribed by said law.

SECTION X. This ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after first publication thereof after final passage.
