## Westfield Rotary Recognized For Support of 'Rotaplast'

WESTFIELD — This year, the Rotary Club of Westfield made a substantial donation to the Rotary International service project "Rotaplast" (Rotary + Plastic Surgery).

Rotary District Governor Adrienne J. Bzura attended last week's Rotary meeting and presented a recognition banner to Rotary Club President Dr. William J. Foley, Rotarian Gary Hunsinger, a member of the Rotary Club of Piscataway, gave a presentation and slide show on the work carried out by a medical team and Rotarian volunteers sent to Argentina.

Rotarian Hunsinger noted that Rotaplast has sent 24 medical missions to five Latin American countries since 1993 and is currently organizing 15 trips per year to provide plastic surgery and educate local surgeons in remedial skills for cleft lips and cleft palates in South America.

Statistics show that South American children are three times more likely to be born with clefts than in the United States. Consequently, in addition to surgery, the teams conduct research into causes of these deformities, counsel child-bearing women on diet and other

issues and advise on dentistry, speech pathology and other issues, Mr. Hunsinger said.

Rotary clubs in host countries make all arrangements with hospitals and select candidates for surgery. They also arrange accommodations and transportation for visiting medical teams and patients.

Mr. Hunsinger said a mission covering 100 children costs about \$400 per child. Transportation, lodging and food is provided for medical professionals, while Rotarians pay their own transportation expenses to the host countries.

## F-SP Rotary Club Recognizes Carol Wood as Top Volunteer

GARWOOD — Each year, the Fanwood-Scotch Plains Rotary Club gives recognition to a person who has gone "above and beyond" in giving of their time and talent to the community, both local and global.

Fanwood Mayor Louis C. Jung had two presentations for her. One was a resolution from the Fanwood Borough Council commending Mrs. Wood for her diverse and extensive work with many municipal committees. Mrs. Wood is a freshman member of the governing body.

The other was an award from United States Congressman Michael A. Ferguson, who could not be present for the ceremony. Mrs. Wood was given a Certificate of Congressional Recognition for her varied volunteer efforts.

Mrs. Wood has been a Rotary Club member since 1993, serving in many capacities, including Past President, current Fundraiser Chairwoman and a "Paul Harris Fellow" recipient.

In terms of community service, Mrs. Wood has served on the Fanwood Community Assessment Committee, Strategic Planning Committee, Board of Health, Board of Adjustment and Planning Board,

besides her recent election to the Borough Council.

Mrs. Wood's International service took focus last year as she worked on the club's "Gift of Life" project. The "Gift of Life" brought 10-month-old Dylan, and his mother, from Panama to the United States so that he could have life saving, open-heart surgery.

Beyond that, Mrs. Wood has continually supported the Rotary Foundation.

Mrs. Wood is Vice President of Century 21, Taylor & Love Realtors in Westfield. She has been a Century 21 Million Dollar Club member for 23 years and a member of the Westfield Board of Realtors since 1972, holding a position on the Board of Directors since 1987.

In addition to her Rotary volunteer dedication, Mrs. Wood has been a member of the Fanwood-Scotch Plains YMCA Board of Directors for over 20 years. She was President of the board from 1987 to 1993, and currently serves as Vice President in charge of fundraising.

Mrs. Wood said she was "absolutely thrilled" by the award and gave thanks to all of her families that were present that evening. She explained that here, families included not only her family of origin, but also her families in the Rotary, in business and the community.

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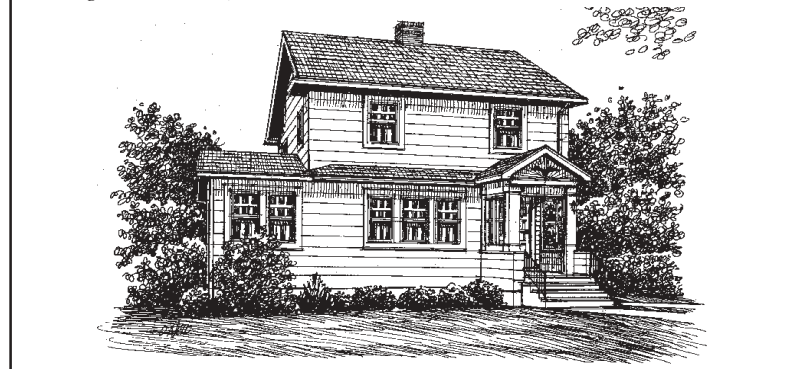

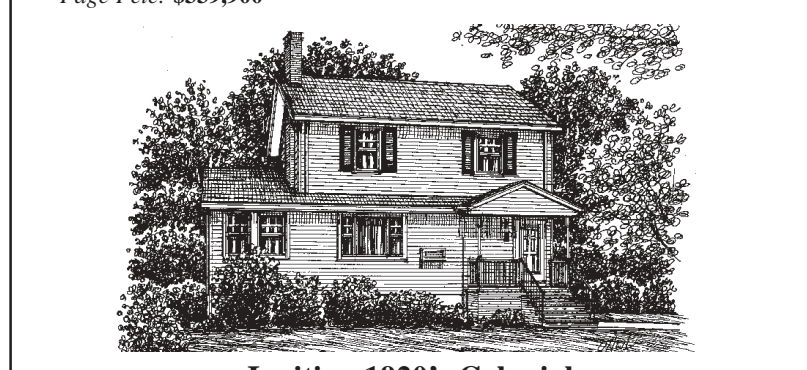

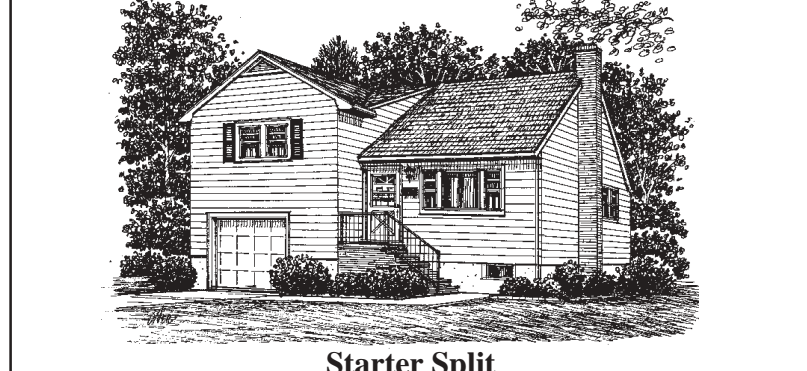
