

Assemblymen Suliga, Green, Freeholder Stender Join Mayor McGreevey at Senior Lunch

LINDEN — Assemblyman and State Senate Candidate Joseph Suliga, along with Democratic Gubernatorial Candidate James McGreevey and Union County Democratic Chairwoman Charlotte DeFilippo, welcomed over 500 Union County Seniors to an afternoon luncheon recently at Mr. Suliga's home in Linden.

"New Jersey's seniors have serious issues facing them," said Mr. Suliga, a Democrat who is running in the newly-realigned 22nd Legislative District which includes Scotch Plains and Fanwood. "They are concerned about getting their NJ Saver and Homestead rebate checks quickly and on time. They have trouble dealing with the problems of the bureaucracy in Trenton. New Jersey's seniors have contributed so much to our state and now they expect their public officials to give something back."

Mr. Suliga, who has represented the 20th District in the State Assembly for the past eight years, is run-

ning for the Senate seat being vacated by the retiring Acting Governor and Senate President, Donald T. DiFrancesco. Mr. Suliga is running with current 17th District Assemblyman Jerry Green and three-term Union County Freeholder and former Fanwood Mayor, Linda d. Stender.

Mr. McGreevey highlighted some of his key issues for the upcoming governor's race, such as improving New Jersey's bureaucracy, as well as protecting and improving the Homestead and NJ Saver rebate programs. He said he was also quite impressed with the show of local strength displayed by the Union County's seniors.

"The give and take with people, the interaction with local officials, that is trademark Jim McGreevey," said Assemblyman Suliga. "This turnout speaks volumes about the high level of support that Jim McGreevey has developed with the seniors of our state. Over the last few years, Jim has gone back and forth across our state and he has taken up

the issues that effect New Jersey's seniors. Jim's message is right for

the New Jersey and it is right for New Jersey's seniors."
