Author-Sailor to Visit Westfield Library

WESTFIELD - The Friends of the Westfield Memorial Library has invited the public to hear David Shaw, a Westfield author and sailor, discuss his book "Flying Cloud" on Wednesday, November 14, at 7:30 p.m. in the Program Room.

Refreshments will be provided from 7 to 7:30 p.m. The author will also be available that evening for informal conversation and book signing. Books will be on hand for purchase if desired.

"Flying Cloud: The True Story of America's Most Famous Clipper Ship and the Woman Who Guided Her" details the maiden voyage of the tall ship which set a speed record of 89 days from New York to San Francisco in 1851. The record stood unbroken until 1989.

The woman of the title, Eleanor Creesy, was unique among captains' wives in that she served as navigator continually on voyages during which her husband had command.

The author of six books and more than 700 articles, Mr. Shaw also spent four years in the early 1990s sailing solo through the major waterways of the northeast. He has earned his sailing distinctions despite severe visual limitations.
