# SCHULTZ STRIKES GOLD TWICE, ADDS AN ASSIST

## Soccer Blue Devils Penetrate Cougar Boys' Lair, Win 3-0

Junior striker Billy Schultz was on the mark, scored two goals and assisted on another to lead the red-hot, 12-4 Westfield High School boys' soccer team to a 3-0 victory over the Cranford Cougars (4-10-2) in Cranford on October 24. Since dropping their opening game to a surprisingly strong Linden team, the Blue Devils have been steadily improving.

"We have reached a good point. The whole team is playing well. This is two games in-a-row that we went out and took it to another team, put goals in and took a lot of pressure off," commented Blue Devil Head Coach George Kapner.

The Cougars brought the attack to the Blue Devils' turf early, dominating for nearly 10 minutes. The closest they came to scoring, however, was when Brian Gemmel brought the ball toward the left corner and sent a shot into the box to striker Ed Aranzazy, who failed to get a good foot on it.

Quickly, the momentum changed and stayed when Blue Devil senior striker Duffy Lau brought the ball down the right side and crossed to

Schultz in the middle. Schultz drilled a shot that was tipped slightly by goalie Brian Woglon but the ball embedded into the upper center of the net with just 12:09 off the clock.

"Duff and I like to play unselfishly together, giving each other the ball," said Schultz. "When we find each other open, we get the ball to each other. Works good!"

One minute and nine seconds later with Woglon hovering about seven yards in front of the net, Schultz

"Coach is always telling us to shoot and shoot more. That's how you score goals. So I figured that I would take a shot and it was lucky enough to go in," chuckled Schultz.

More complex offensive maneuvers came and the Tomasso brothers, senior Anthony and sophomore Lee, got into the act. As Lau brought the ball down the right side, Lee Tomasso drifted into the center and Schultz slipped to the left side. Lau crossed to Lee, who skid the ball to Schultz,
