fense, some impressive plays were made. Andzell and Jenkins joined in on a 16-yard sack of quarterback Jamar Talbert at the end of first quarter. Cook made a leaping interception at the 15-yard line. McKeon tipped a potential TD pass in the end zone in the second quarter.

Brinkman was responsible for a blocked point after touchdown (PAT) attempt after the Minutemen's first TD. Defensive back Mike DeFazio knocked down a potential TD pass.

The problem was that no one could stop Halsey except the referees. He had a 39-yard TD run and a 30-yard TD run negated due to holding penalties. The Minutemen were also penalized for clipping, holding and illegal motion.

Tranchina reflected, "I remember Tony Stewart at Union years and years ago and we played against Tyrell Dorsch at Hoboken a couple of years ago. Halsey is every bit as good as those two. We played against him a couple of times last year but he's bigger and stronger this year. I thought that we hit him hard a bunch of times but he kept going."
