Hillsborough Topples Devils in Field Hockey

The ability to get to the ball quickly paid off as the fifth-seeded Hillsborough High School field hockey team grabbed a 2-0 victory over the fourth-seeded Blue Devil girls in the quarterfinals of the North Jersey, Section 2, Group 4 tournament in Westfield on November 2. Amanda Morrison scored a quick goal in the first half and Jenn Geigert added another in the second half to earn the Raiders a trip to face top-seeded Steinert.

Westfield controlled the ball for the vast majority of the first half but Hillsborough came through with a quick goal by Morrison on a corner assist from Heather LaVoie with 17:55 left. The Blue Devils could not penetrate the Raider defense that had the uncanny knack to get to the ball before forwards Caitlin MacDonald or Christina Popola could get off the shot.

The Raiders caught the Blue Devils off-balance at the start of the second half and nearly scored but goalie Molly Gibbons made a nice stop. The Blue Devil offense quickly responded and nearly scored when Katherine Hild and Popola slipped by the defenders and forced the Raider goalie to make a diving stop.

The second Hillsborough goal also came in a flash. Despite the Blue Devils' constant offensive pressure, the Raiders gained possession, quickly brought the ball down field and scored when Geigert, from the left side, slanted a shot into the right side of the

goal with 15:52 remaining. Both the Blue Devils and the Raiders had seven legitimate shots on goal but Westfield had 16 corners to Hillsborough's six.

"They outplayed us today," said Blue Devil Head Coach Maggie McFadden. "We certainly came out and did what we could to try and put the ball in the goal, especially in the second half. We had the ball on their end a lot, but could not get the goal. Our corners weren't working well. Their flies were coming out and doing a fantastic job of disrupting the plays. That really hurt because we didn't have the time to set up corner plays the way we would have liked. I called every corner play we had to see which one would work."

She added, "Our midfielders have been playing well all year. They may have been a little off today, but Hillsborough's quest was to control the middle of the field and that neutralized us."

Westfield finished 10-4-3, quite a remarkable turnaround from the preseason expectations.

"They played better than I expected all season long. And a lot of it had to do with the fact that they played well together. If we broke down in one position, the whole team broke down," pointed out McFadden. "We had four losses this year, two were to Oak Knoll, one was to Voorhees and one was to Hillsborough. So, I certainly can't be disappointed. I am very pleased with the way the kids played."

MINTZ MASHES 2 GOALS, PERROTTA GETS 2 ASSISTS

Lady SP-F Raiders Bombard Nutley Soccer Raiders, 4-1

Persistent aggressiveness paid off for the Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School girls' soccer team. The hosting fourth-seeded SP-F Raiders bombarded the fifth-seeded Nutley Raiders' goal with 22 shots to earn a 4-1 victory in the quarterfinals of the North Jersey, Group 3 Section 2 tournament on November 1.

Sophomore Chelsea Mintz positioned herself correctly to net two goals and freshman Lauren Perrotta's

effective corner kicks earned her two assists. Junior Megan Reddington and sophomore Michele Fischer penetrated deep into the box and added one goal each.

"They were excellent," said Raider Head Coach Frank Butz of the accuracy of Perrotta's corner kicks.

"Our girls have been working very hard. It's been a nice season," added Butz.

Raider junior goalie Lauren Bianco made five saves; however, on the few occasions that Nutley penetrated SP-F turf, senior sweeper Kellie LaForge and senior defender Jamye Ferrara used their speed and toughness to ward off the aggression.

Butz lauded Ferrara's and LaForge's performances, saying, "Jamye is so fast and Kellie is so tough. They have been tough all season."

Senior forward Jill Koscielecki and sophomore forward Lauren Belford worked together to soften the Nutley defense. From the game's onset, Koscielecki moved the ball up the middle and crossed to the right side where Belford would zing several shots over the crossbar.

The assault continued with no results as freshman Jenna Balestriere hooked down to the left sideline and skid the ball to Fischer positioned in front of the near post. Fischer's scribbler was smothered by the nervous Nutley goalie, Tara Vonroth. Moments later, Koscielecki sent a direct kick whizzing into Vonroth's arms. Fischer took another shot that forced

Belford booted the ball to Fischer about three feet in front of the goal. Fischer's sliding kick got the Raiders on the board. Six minutes later, Perrotta lined a corner kick just inches in front of the post. Charging forward, Mintz tapped the ball into the net. With 13:32 left in the half, Perrotta ripped another corner kick into the box where Reddington headed it across the goal line, giving the SP-F Raiders a 3-0 lead.

Describing her success with her corner kicks, Perrotta said, "The first one, I was just hoping to get it far and high and into the middle. And, Mintz put it in. The second one was so close to the post that the goalie thought that it was going out but Megan got the goal."

"I was standing on the near post, Lauren (Perrotta) put it right in and I fired it into the back of the net," said Mintz, explaining her first goal.

Nutley retaliated with 8:18 left in the half when Brook Delucca broke loose down the middle and drilled the ball into the net. Four minutes later, Delucca attempted an encore, but LaForge headed her to the outside.

The SP-F Raiders' fourth goal came with 5:52 remaining in the game when Balestriere passed the ball into the box to Mintz, who rippled the net.

Mintz simply said, "I was in front of the goal again, the ball came in and I fired it in."

Previously, the Raiders had sunk into a five-game slump but, recently, seemed to find the mark with two

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF WESTFIELD CHAPTER 13, "MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC," ARTICLE I, SEC. 13-5 "THROUGH STREETS"

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Westfield of the County of Union, as follows:

SECTION I. That the Code of the Town of Westfield be and is hereby amended by revising CHAPTER 13, "MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC," ARTICLE I, SEC. 13-5 "THROUGH STREETS" be placed in the appropriate order of streets, alphabetized by first letter so that the same shall read as follows:

Title Place

a. Between Montauk Drive and Faulkner Drive

b. Between Faulkner Drive and Sandy Hill Road

SECTION II. Any or all ordinances or parts thereof in conflict, or inconsistent, with any part of the terms of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are in such conflict or inconsistent.

SECTION III. In the event that any section, part of provision of this ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court, such holdings shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part so held unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION IV. This ordinance shall take effect after passage and publication as soon as, and in the manner, provided by law.
